Office of the Child and Family Ombudsman: Budget Rationale

Proposed Appropriation: There is appropriated from the general fund to the department of justice \$250,000 for the biennium beginning July, 1 2013.

This estimated appropriation is based upon the budget history of Montana's *Mental Health Care Ombudsman* [established pursuant to 2-15-210, MCA].* The cost projected in the fiscal note to the bill establishing the Mental Health Care Ombudsman [SB-239 of 2009] was \$250,000 for FY 2000 and 2001 combined.

The first ombudsman to hold that office [Bonnie Adee] confirms that the annual operating costs in those first two years was approximately \$90,000 plus \$90,000, with the remaining set-up costs bringing the budget for that biennium up to \$250,000.

The annual expenditures recorded by the *Mental Health Care Ombudsman* have been fairly consistent, except for the year 2008. From Fiscal Year 2007 to Fiscal Year 2012 the expenditures have been as follows:
