JOINT RESOLUTION 2011-1

BETWEEN POWELL COUNTY AND GRANITE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Boards of Commission of Powell and Granite Counties are appreciative of our legislative representatives diligent public service on behalf of the people.

WHEREAS, redistricting of legislative districts cause both Powell County and Granite County to be divided into multiple districts.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County are more alike than different in custom and culture.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share rural characteristics. Powell County has 1,488,889 acres and a population of 7,027 people while Granite County has 1,105,548 acres and a population of 3,074 people. This information is from the 2010 census.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share significant agricultural economic factors with 273 ranches in Powell County and 104 ranches in Granite County. (Agricultural Statistical Services USDA)

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share significant timber harvest and wood product economic factors with 25% of the workforce in Powell County employed in this sector and approximately 13% in Granite County.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County both have large percentages of federal forest land with Powell County having 639,018 acres and Granite County having 660,779 acres.

WHEREAS, Powell County has one incorporated town, Deer Lodge, and Granite County has two incorporated towns, Philipsburg and Drummond.

WHEREAS, tourism is a vital part of the economy for both Powell County and Granite County.

WHEREAS, population, boundaries and shared characteristics equal a single legislative district.

WHEREAS, both counties have held hearings and received public support.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Powell County and Granite County should be a single legislative district and both counties respectfully request the Legislative Redistricting Commission



Powell, Granite counties ask for legislative merger

DEER LODGE - Powell County and Granite County are more alike than different, and they should be in the same legislative district.

That's the meat of a joint resolution by commissioners of the two counties, the first time they've ever gotten together to author such a thing, reports P.J. Wright of the Silver State Post.

Legislative redistricting takes place every 10 years after the U.S. Census. Wright said the resolution will be sent to a state commission charged with redistricting. It says the two counties are almost exactly the same size - about 1.2 million acres - though Powell County has roughly 7,000 people and Granite County 2,100.

They share significant "timber harvest and wood product economic factors," large portions of federal forest land and a vital tourist industry. If the combined legislative district is granted, it'll stretch from Powell County's northern boundary, in the middle of the Bob Marshall Wilderness east of Condon, to the southern toe of Granite County, at the Continental Divide not far east of Sula.

The final legislative redistricting plan will be presented to the 2013 Legislature.

Superior firehouse likely to be rebid, chief says

SUPERIOR - Twelve bids came in for the general contract to build a new firehouse in Superior. It looks like they'll all be rejected.

Fire Chief John Woodland told the Mineral Independent's Kyle Spurr that with some minor changes in the specifications, the baseline bid could be lower.

"We are pretty comfortable that where we are going is we will reject all bids and then go back and rebid it," said Woodland, who predicted a groundbreaking as early as Jan. 1.

The bids ranged from roughly \$733,000 by Patterson Construction to more than \$1 million by Dick Anderson Construction. Each included 11 alternate amounts for different items, including paving, extra windows, spray insulation, sprinklers and a fire hydrant. By adjusting the alternate plans, Woodland believes the bids can come in lower.

The firehouse will be built on land behind the old schoolhouse. The fire district received a community block grant for \$346,500 in 2009, and voters last May approved a levy worth \$498,000. The town of Superior has also set aside \$112,000 from its capital improvement budget for the project.

Some of the money went toward buying the land, Spurr said. That purchase closed in August.

New district may emerge

Every 10 years counties have the opportunity to ask the state for changes to their Montana House of Representative district.

And according to Philipsburg local Connie Lord it's time for a change in Granite County.

"We would like Granite County and Powell County to be one legislative district," she told the *Philipsburg Mail*, "this would be better for both political parties in Granite County and in Powell County too."

And those were the sentiments that Lord and Ester McDonald told the Granite County Commissioners on Tuesday. The two explained after they spoke with the commissioners that the current pairing of Granite County with part of Anaconda-Deer Lodge County makes it difficult for a representative of the local area to be elected to the State House. They also said that there are more similarities between Granite County and Powell County than between Granite and Deer Lodge Counties, specifically agriculture.

"Economically and environmentally and you might say socially in a lot of ways ... we share those things in common and that's one of the things their looking for," said Lord, "we don't share as much with Anaconda."

The Board of Commissioners explained to the *Mail* that while they are taking public comment on the possible redistricting, they are not the ones who will decide whether it happens or not. Commissioner Maureen Connor said that having received positive comment and no negative comment from the public they will be considering a joint resolution with Powell County Commissioners stating their desire for the two counties to be

in the same district.

But even though they make the resolution, the five member redistricting commission in Helena does not need to follow the counties' recommendation.

"It does help deliver the message that this is what we want in Powell and Granite County," said Connor, "it's seen as being a way to have a rural representation."

And according to the Commissioners as well as those who provided public comment, being paired with Anaconda makes it difficult for a Granite County candidate to be elected to the House of Representatives. According to the board, the last (publicly elected) representative from Granite County that has served in

the house to the best of their recollection was Lorraine Gillies.

While the commissioners said that the proposed new district would split them from Deer Lodge County and Anaconda, they were adamant to point out that the split did not represent negative feelings towards Anaconda or Deer Lodge County.

According to information provided by the Montana State website, the 2010 population of Montana is 984,000.

The redistricting commission, which includes four members appointed by majority and minority leaders of both the House and Senate and a fifth member selected by the first four or the Supreme

Court meets every 10 years to decide whether to change district boundaries. The ideal size of the 100 House Districts should be around 9,840 people. The 50 Senate Districts should be twice that size at around 19,600 people.

According to Connie Lord, Granite County's House district used to include parts of Powell County and up to Seeley Lake. And based on what she has heard from both major political parties in

Granite County, a number of people would like to see some version of that old district once again. And opposition to the new district lines? "So far none. None that we know about," she said.

The County's contracted planner for the policy revisions, Brent Moore, met with a number of citizens and groups in town to discuss goals and visions they have for the burg.

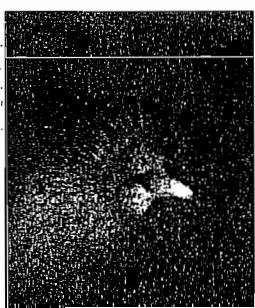
After gathering record of those sentiments he created a draft of the section which then went through a scoping process as well as public

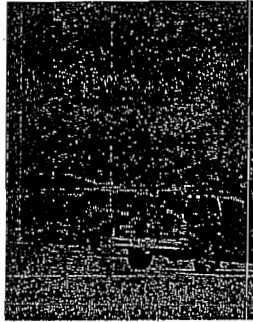

"The integration of the new signs was originally slated to be gradual, when the MDT looked into the signs along Route One they found out that they were all scheduled for replacement. In total including signs along Interstate 90, Route One, and Skalkaho Road (Route 38) there are 18 signs.

"Once the legislation was completed and enrolled we looked at all the signs and they were all scheduled for replacement," she said noting that soon the design of the signs along the route will all be consistent.

Route One was designated as a scenic route 33 years ago when it was named the first scenic route in Montana.

According to the May 25, 1978 edition of the *Phillipsburg Mail* the "Pintlar Scenic Route" was opened with a ceremony as well as a 40-car motorcade which traversed the 65 mile route. At the opening on May 21, 1978 there were ribbon cutting ceremonies at Drummond and Opportunity as well as stops at Phillipsburg, Denton's Point, Anaconda, and Fairmont Hot Springs.

"Montana Governor Thomas Judge addressed an enthusiastic group of Pintlar Scenic Route motorcade participants at a luncheon Sunday at Denton's Point," stated the *Mail*, "he used many complimentary words to describe the natural beauty of the country along Highway 10-A."

Honored Commission Members,

I am the representative from House District 84. I feel this district is a great example of what not to do this next redistricting cycle. The following are the reasons I believe this, along with suggestions to help more closely meet the redistricting guidelines and requirements:

While the District may be contiguous on the map, I cannot drive from one end to the other, on pavement, without leaving the district. Once I reach Macdonald Pass on the Powell County side there is no way to get to the North Helena Valley without leaving the District. Once I get to Lincoln, to continue on to another 40-50 miles of the District, I have to use gravel roads to stay in the District and to go around Lincoln.

The towns of Ovando (Powell County) and Lincoln (Lewis & Clark County) are divided with only small portions (about 50 voters ea) in HD84 - the remainder are in HD17, along with Augusta. This breaks up those communities into two separate districts.

There are 17 Precincts in HD84. These people do not share the same political concerns and issues with their more distant neighbors. An example would be Pct 16 in Powell County (the town of Racetrack) and the people in Lewis & Clark County Pct 43 (the town of Craig). Nor do they share the same issues with the majority of the northern Helena Valley, Marysville, Canyon Creek, Silver City, or Helmsville. The residents of the Helena Valley, which includes portions of several of the Helena districts, do not share the same political concerns and issues as do the people that live in the downtown area of Helena. They certainly are not part of the same community or neighborhood.

The rural population of Lewis & Clark County makes up about 80% of the population in HD84 with most of the rural population in Powell County making up the remainder. I can certainly understand that in rural areas, multiple small communities must be combined with other small communities over a large distance. But breaking those small communities apart does not make sense.

In my opinion, it would be more logical, and more in complying with the requirements to keep like communities and neighborhoods together and to make districts compact and contiguous, to combine all of Powell County with all of Granite County to form one district that would more closely reflect neighborhoods and communities that share similar political concerns and issues. The new district would be large in area at just over 4000 sq. mi. and would contain just over 10,000 people - well within the 3% deviation that you have adopted. It would be possible to drive from one end to the other on pavement.

Counties endorse redistricting

For the very first time, the Commissioners of Powell and Granite counties authored a joint resolution. In this case, it was for the legislative redistricting which takes place every 10 years following the taking of the U.S. Census. Both County Commissioner bodies are asking for the two counties to be put into the same legislative district.

The resolution will be sent to the Districting and Apportionment Commission which has authority to draw the boundaries of congressional and legislative districts.

The joint county resolution asserts that Powell and Granite counties are more alike than different in custom and culture, that they share rural characteristics. It goes on to say Powell County has 1.2 million acres and a population of 7027 people while Granite County also has 1.2 million acres and a population of 2074 people.

The resolution further compares the significant "timber harvest and wood product economic factors." Each county has large percentages of federal forest land and tourism is a vital economy for both Powell and Granite Counties.

The commissioners state in their joint resolution that the population, boundaries and shared characteristics "equal a single legislative district."

When the final legislative redistricting plan is made, it will be presented to the 2013 Legislature for review and recommendations. The Legislature has 30 days to make recommendations to the Commission. Within 30 days of receiving the Legislature's recommendations, the Commission must file the redistricting plan with the Secretary of State and it becomes law. Although the Commission may modify the plan to accommodate the Legislature's recommendations, it is not required to do so. The legislative plan will be in effect for the 2014 election cycle.

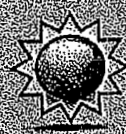

The Board of Commissioners for Powell County, Montana, met in regular session at 10:00 o'clock A.M. Present: Presiding Officer Cele Pohle and Members, Donna Young and Ralph E. Mannix, Jr.

Commissioner Pohle received notice via email from Patricia Renevier, Natural Resource Conservation Service (NRCS) of the executed copies of Project Agreement #69-0325-12-023, Jens Bridge area flood repair. A copy is on file in the Clerk and Recorder's office.

BETWEEN POWELL COUNTY AND GRANITE COUNTY

WHEREAS, the Boards of Commission of Powell and Granite Counties are appreciative of our legislative representatives diligent public service on behalf of the people.

WHEREAS, redistricting of legislative districts cause both Powell County and Granite County to be divided into multiple districts.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County are more alike than difference in custom and culture.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share rural characteristics. Powell County has 1.2 million acres and a population of 7027 people while Granite County also has 1.2 million acres and a population of 3074 people. This information is from the 2010 census.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share significant agricultural economic factors with 273 ranches in Powell County and 104 ranches in Granite County. (Agricultural Statistical Services USDA).

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County share significant timber harvest and wood product economic factors with 25% of the workforce in Powell County employed in this sector and ____% in Granite County.

WHEREAS, Powell County and Granite County both have large percentages of federal forest land with Powell County having 630,018 acres and Granite County having 660,779 acres.
