A Bill for an Act entitled: "An Act creating a board of dental practitioners consisting of dental hygienists, denturists, and members of the public; transferring control of dental hygienists and denturists from the board of dentistry to the board of dental practitioners; and amending sections 2-15-1732 and 37-29-102, MCA."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Montana:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Board of dental practitioners. (1)
There is a board of dental practitioners.

- (2) The board consists of eight members appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate.
- (3) The members are three dental hygienists and three denturists and two members of the public. One of the public members shall represent the interests of senior citizens.

#### Ouestions:

- 1) Given the disparity in licensee numbers, is it appropriate for a 2-2-3 board because dental hygienists have nearly 35 times the number of licensees as denturists?
- 2) Should there be a dentist liaison on this board to weigh in on technical issues?

Each member who is a dental hygienist or a denturist must be licensed to practice in this state, must have actively engaged in

practice for at least 5 continuous years before being appointed to the board, and must be actively engaged in practice while serving on the board. Board members must be residents of this state.

- (4) Each member shall serve a 4-year term. The terms must be staggered. The governor may remove a member only for neglect or cause.
  - (5) The governor shall fill any vacancy within 30 days.
- (6) The board is allocated to the department for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121.

senior citizen. All members are appointed by the governor with the consent of the senate. Each licensed member must be licensed to practice as a dentist, denturist, or dental hygienist in this state, must have actively practiced in this state for at least 5 continuous years immediately before the member's appointment, and must be actively engaged in practice while serving on the board. Each member must be a resident of this state.

(3) Each member shall serve for a term of 5 years. The

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governor may remove a member only for neglect or cause.

- (4) The governor shall fill any vacancy within 30 days.
- (5) The board is allocated to the department for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121."

Section 3. Section 37-29-102, MCA, is amended to read:

"37-29-102. **Definitions.** As used in this chapter, unless the context requires otherwise, the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Board" means the state board of dentistry dental practitioners provided for in 2-15-1732 [section 1].
- (2) "Denture" means any removable full or partial upper or lower prosthetic dental appliance to be worn in the mouth.
- (3) "Denturist" means a person licensed under this chapter to engage in the practice of denturitry.
- (4) "Department" means the department of labor and industry provided for in Title 2, chapter 15, part 17.
- (5) "Immediate denture" means a denture constructed prior to and inserted immediately after extraction of teeth.
- (6) "Practice of
  denturitry" means:
- (a) the making, fitting,
  constructing, altering,
  reproducing, or repairing of a
  denture and furnishing or
  supplying of a denture
