

Montana and U.S. Personal Income Growth






Withholding, Employment, and Wages

Indexed to Jan. 2005 and Smoothed with a six month moving average






Montana Average Annual Wages





Montana and U.S. Unemployment Rate




Industry 2011 Employment and

Job Change During Recession (2007 to 2010) and Recovery (2010 to 2011)






2011 Unemployment Rates by Region






U.S. Unemployment by Education Level
