## <u>SJR 23 STUDY OF NONPROFIT INCOME TAX AND PROPERTY TAX EXEMPTIONS</u> - Megan Moore, Committee staff

## Analysis of imposing income tax on nonprofit organizations

Ms. Moore discussed the methodology and analysis of the data on Montana corporate tax that certain nonprofit corporations might pay if they were not exempt (Exhibit 4). Ms. Moore also provided updated data for the organizations in the analysis (Exhibit 5).

SEN. GILLAN said that she wanted to make sure that procedurally, the Committee passes an appropriate motion. REP. HOLLANDSWORTH said that he would like to put this issue on the back burner.
