- The committee deferred the Department of Transportation's bill draft request until September.
- The committee approved the Department of Revenue's bill draft requests: to improve transparency of property tax; allow for electronic service of notices of levy and writs of execution; allow for recording notices of state tax liens with the Secretary of State's Office; married filing separately disclosure solution; eliminate errors in the calculation of taxes, fees, and assessments to the local government; provide equal treatment of licensees under the liquor control penalty statute; clarifying existing agency liquor store laws; allowing de minimus refund of abandoned property on closed estates; and clarifying the distribution of in-state lodging taxes paid by state agencies.
- The committee deferred until the September meeting, the following Department of Revenue's bill draft requests: corporate income tax-tax havens; nonprofit tax information; create individual liability for trust taxes; simplify connoisseur tax, and add a license type for new growing business model - brew on premise.
