- The Revenue and Transportation Interim Committee will co-sponsor the State Administration and Veterans' Affairs Interim Committee proposed legislation to transfer agency monitoring of the State Tax Appeal Board from SAVA to RTIC.
- For the SJR23 Taxpayer Appeal Study:
 - the committee requested the language in LC02v3 for the industrial appeals bill (already requested as LC254) and asked staff to continue to work with stakeholders and present a new draft in November. Rep. Hunter will sponsor the bill.
