A Bill for an Act entitled: "An Act revising how the commissioner of political practices is appointed; amending sections 13-37-102 and 13-37-104, MCA; and providing an immediate effective date."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Montana:

Section 1. Section 13-37-102, MCA, is amended to read:

- "13-37-102. Creation of office -- nomination -- appointment

 -- removal. (1) There is a commissioner of political practices
 who is appointed by the governor, subject to confirmation by a
 majority of the senate.
- (2) (a) A four-member selection nomination committee composed of the speaker of the house, the president of the senate, and the minority leaders of both houses of the legislature shall submit to the governor a list of not less than two or more than five names of individuals for the governor's consideration. A majority of the members of the selection nomination committee shall agree upon each nomination.
- (b) The governor shall appoint the commissioner from the list of nominees submitted by the nomination committee. However, if the nomination committee fails to submit names agreed to by the majority of nomination committee members, the governor may appoint anyone who meets the qualifications set forth in 13-37-

107.

(2)(3) The individual selected to serve as commissioner may be removed by the governor prior to the expiration of the term only for incompetence, malfeasance, or neglect of duty. The governor's decision to remove the commissioner must be stated in writing, and the sufficiency of the governor's stated causes for removing the commissioner is subject to judicial review."

Section 2. Section 13-37-104, MCA, is amended to read:

- "13-37-104. Vacancy. (1) If for any reason a vacancy occurs in the position of commissioner, a successor must be appointed within 30 days as provided in $13-37-102\frac{(1)}{(1)}$ within 30 days of the vacancy to serve out the unexpired term. Each nomination The governor's appointee must be confirmed by the senate, but a nomination an appointment made while the senate is not in session is effective as an appointment until the end of the next session.
- (2) An individual who is selected to serve out the unexpired term of a preceding commissioner and who has served 3 years or more of an unexpired term is not eligible for reappointment.
- (3) An individual who is selected to serve out the unexpired term of a preceding commissioner and who has served less than 3 years may be reappointed for a 6-year term as provided in $13-37-102\frac{(1)}{(1)}$."
