The Jan. 6 meeting starts at 9 a.m. in room 172 of the capitol. Enclosed are the meeting materials. The materials are also online at www.leg.mt.gov/water.

- Tab 1: Water rights adjudication updates from the Department of Natural Resources and Conservation (DNRC) and from the Water Court, as required by statute
- Tab 2: Three documents related to water transfers, including the executive summary of a report produced by the Western States Water Council, and a background on water transfers allowed under Montana law
- Tab 3: A copy of a 2007 complaint filed by the state of Montana against
 Wyoming alleging illegal water use; this issue went to trial this fall (see news

A notable omission from your packet is proposed DNRC administrative rules related to exempt groundwater wells. In September, the WPIC commented on previously proposed rules and recommended the EQC formally object to the rules. The EQC objected, and the agency subsequently withdrew the proposed rule. The DNRC has since drafted a new, proposed definition of a combined appropriation. Staff will send you a copy of the new definition as soon as it is noticed in the Montana Administrative Register.
