





Alzheimer's & Dementia

- Dementia is a loss of memory due to changes in the brain
- Alzheimer's is most common
- Age is greatest risk factor
- Some causes are reversible




It is <u>not</u> normal aging.

71% increase in Alzheimer's deaths between 2000- 2013








Changing the Trajectory of Alzheimer's Disease: How a Treatment by 2025 Saves Lives and Dollars

DELAYED ONSET
