Re: Sage grouse conservation funding summary

In September, the EQC asked for a summary of all funding spent on sage grouse conservation across the country. Attached, please find a best guess.

Most of the data comes from the Western Governors' Association (WGA) Sage-Grouse Inventory, 2014 Initiatives. The exceptions are data for appropriations made by the Montana Legislature in 2015 and funding provided to the NRCS Sage Grouse Initiative in the most recent Farm Bill.

When added together, the funding totals \$1,123,897,500. The expenditures date as far back as the year 2000.

There are a couple of caveats. First, the WGA report may not reflect all funding sources.

Second, some of the reported funding benefited the Gunnison Sage-grouse (not a concern in Montana) in addition to the Greater Sage-grouse. The WGA report does not clearly delineate how much money was spent per type of sage grouse.

Lastly, it is unclear how partner matching funds tabulated prior to FY 2015 for the NRCS Sage Grouse Initiative might also be reflected in other federal, state, county, industry, and nonprofit contributions. If all of those partner matching funds were captured twice in this spreadsheet, the total sage grouse funding would decrease to \$999,397,500.
