## Agency Responsibilities:

The Office of the Commissioner of Political Practices (COPP) is attached to the Secretary of State's Office for administrative purposes only. Thus, it acts as a stand alone agency, manages its own budget, staff, and work processes. The COPP's areas of responsibility are listed below.

# Campaign Practices

- Candidates and Political Committees
  - Receives statements of candidacy or organization and business interest disclosure
  - Posts statements for public viewing
  - Certifies to election administrators whether a candidate has complied with all requirements so name may appear on the ballot
- Campaign Finance Reports
  - Receives campaign finance reports.
  - Posts campaign finance reports for public viewing
  - Inspects campaign finance reports for facial compliance with law
- Handles Complaints
  - Accepts, files and posts complaints alleging violations
  - Issues sufficiency (or non-sufficiency) decisions on each complaint
  - Files a sufficiency decision with county attorney
  - May reach settlement or file action in state district court
- Advisory Opinions
  - Issues advisory opinions to clarify law and how it is applied

# Lobbying

- Lobbyists and Principals
  - Accepts registration of and fees for lobbyists and principals. Issues licenses.
- Lobbying Reports
  - Accepts lobbying reports
  - Posts lobbying reports for viewing by public
- Handles Complaints
  - Accepts, files and posts complaints
  - Issues sufficiency (or non-sufficiency) decision on each complaint
  - May settle or file action in state district court
- Advisory Opinions
  - Issues advisory opinions to clarify law and how it is applied

#### **Ethics**

- Accepts ethics complaints concerning actions of state employees and public officials. Complaints are held in confidence and not posted for public viewing.
- Decides ethics complaints through contested case hearings.

- Imposes administrative penalties for ethics violation as provided by law.
- May file court action to seek enforcement
- Issues advisory opinions

#### Budget Summary:

Appropriations to the COPP for the 2017 biennium were 9.3% greater than the 2015 biennium appropriations. The legislature provided general fund increases including:

- \$85,000 each year for contract legal services from the Department of Justice
- \$24,000 for increased building rent
- \$53,260 to support online systems and database maintenance
- \$12,816 for secretarial performance adjustments and temporary services during peak workload periods

In addition, the governor's budget office used discretionary funds to fully fund a legal counsel position (1 FTE).
