SUBJECT: Long-term record storage requirements for electronically stored records

**NOTICE DESCRIPTION:** (e.g. proposal notice/adoption notice): Notice of proposed amendment

**SUMMARY OF RULE(S):** The Secretary of State, after a recommendation by the Local Government Records Committee (which is charged by section 2-6-403, MCA, to "approve, modify, or disapprove proposals for local government records retention and disposition schedules"), proposes to amend one rule concerning storage requirements for electronically stored documents that are to be retained for more than 10 years. Under the current rule, long-term documents stored electronically must also be stored in paper form or on archival quality microfilm. The proposed rule eliminates this requirement and adopts by reference the Association of Records Managers & Administrators International's Generally Accepted Recordkeeping Principles®, which include principles of accountability, integrity, protection, compliance, availability, retention, disposition, and transparency for local governments using electronic systems to store long-term records. The rule states that local governments should use these principles "as the framework to design, implement, operate, and decommission the systems and to manage the records and data . . . . "

**NOTES:** A public hearing is scheduled on the above-referenced rule on August 6, 2015, at 9:30 a.m. in Room 260, State Capitol Building, Helena, Montana. The public comment period ends on August 14, 2015.
