HB 70: Strengthening guardianship services and creating a WINGS group

\*Passed by the House and Senate, signed into law, defunded

**HB 2:** Biennium appropriations including \$54 million in cuts to the DPHHS's

Senior and Long-Term Care Division

\*Passed by the House and Senate, signed into law




