#### LETTER TO SECRETARIES PERDUE AND ZINKE RE: FIRE-RELATED ISSUES

O0:01:16 Hope Stockwell, research analyst, Legislative Services Division, gave an introduction to the letter addressed to Secretary Sonny Perdue, U. S. Department of Agriculture and Secretary Ryan Zinke, U.S. Department of the Interior, that was discussed at the June 30 EQC meeting. (Exhibit 1) She said Mr. Vincent had proposed an addition to the letter, but that Secretary Perdue has just approved emergency haying on Conservation Reserve Program (CRP) acres in the drought stricken areas of Montana effective July 16.

Mr. Vincent said he had suggested the addition to the letter in order to allow landowners to protect their properties from wildfires and allow haying on CRP land before July 15. He said the additional language is no longer needed.
