## Montana Natural Heritage Program History with the MT Noxious Weed Trust Fund Program

- The MT Noxious Weed Trust Fund (NWTF) is a grant program administered through the Montana Department of Agriculture. The NWTF was established by the legislature in 1985 for the education, research, and on-the-ground control of noxious weeds in the state.
- The Department grants funds for the purchase and application of chemicals for noxious weed control and therefor follows MEPA standards in reviewing proposed projects.
- In 1992, the Department had a Programmatic Environmental Impact Statement (PEIS) drafted to assess how to best meet MEPA standards. An amended PEIS was drafted in 2010 to account for aquatic weed control and new pesticide products.
- To meet MEPA standards, NWTF grantees proposing to purchase and apply chemicals must complete an Environmental Assessment (EA) as part of the project application. The EA includes practices and mitigation strategies concerning general vegetation, soils, ground and surface water, fish and wildlife, threatened and endangered species, air quality, and historical/cultural resources.
- In 2001, the NWTF began granting funds to the Montana Natural Heritage Program (MNHP) to assist in gathering the information needed to complete parts of the EAs. The MNHP provides detailed information about the habitat, wildlife, and TES species in the project area to the project coordinator upon request.
- In 2015, the NWTF began granting funds to the MNHP for updating plants and their status into the database in which biological information is pulled for the EA's.
- Beginning in FY18, project coordinators are required to include an environmental summary report from the MNHP in their new applications. Those reports can only be accessed currently by MNHP staff or NWTF program staff.
- The MNHP and all the information they house and provide to our project coordinators, is crucial for completing documents required by the NWTF program.
