A Bill for an Act entitled: "An Act creating a permanent Indian education council; providing for appointment of council members by tribal governments to staggered terms; outlining duties and requiring annual reports to the governor, the board of public education, and the office of public instruction; and providing an immediate effective date."

Be it enacted by the Legislature of the State of Montana:

NEW SECTION. Section 1. Indian education council -composition -- duties. (1) There is an Indian education council. The council is composed of:

- one representative of each of the seven reservations, appointed by the governor from a list of up to three nominees provided by each of the respective tribal governments; and
- (b) one person appointed by the governor from a list of up to three nominees submitted by the Little Shell band of Chippewa Indians.
- (2) Members of the council shall serve staggered 2-year terms. A vacancy on the council must be filled in the same manner as the original appointment and only for the unexpired portion of the term.
 - The council shall: (3)

- (a) advise the governor, the board of public education, and the superintendent of public instruction in educational matters affecting the education of Indian students, including accreditation, certification, and teacher training;
- (b) promote equal educational opportunity and improve the quality of education provided American Indian students throughout the state;
- (c) advocate for, monitor, and evaluate the implementation of Article X of the Montana constitution for all educational agencies;
- (d) facilitate communication about Indian education among all stakeholders in Montana;
- (e) develop strategies of communication to allow constituents to provide imput to the council on the needs and issues related to Indian education;
- (f) identify and disseminate research-based measurable criteria, both behavioral and academic, that indicate successful education for Montana's Indian children;
- (g) collect and analyze data to monitor accountability of educational agencies to address the needs of Indian education;
- (h) encourage and promote the active participation of Indian people, tribes, and tribal organizations in the education process;
- (i) prepare budgetary recommendations to be submitted to the governor and the office of public instruction for programs that affect the council's duties as outlined in this section;
 - (j) monitor and advocate legislation that potentially

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affects Indian education in Montana;

- (k) present an annual report to the governor, the board of public education, and the office of public instruction; and
- (m) perform any other duties necessary to implement the provisions of this part.
- (4) The council is allocated to the governor's office for administrative purposes only as prescribed in 2-15-121.
- (5) Members of the council shall serve without pay but are entitled to reimbursement for travel, meals, and lodging pursuant to 2-18-501 through 2-18-503.

NEW SECTION. Section 2. {standard} Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an integral part of Title 20, chapter 1, part 5, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 1, part 5, apply to [section 1].

NEW SECTION. Section 3. {standard} Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.

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
