







An Aging Nation



Effects of an Aging Population




- More consumer spending to healthcare

- Changing demands on housing and communities





Labor Force Participation





Prime working age = 25 to 54






Montana Labor Force Participation Rates








10-Year Wage Growth by State








Net Migration by State







Destinations of In-migrants from Other States



Net Migration within Montana






Demographics of In-Migrants

Education Level of In-Migrants vs. Statewide Population, and Net Flows, 2013-2017*






Changing Economy in Montana Share of Total GDP by Industry






Montana Payroll Employment Share by Industry

 - Adding roughly 255 jobs per year
 - Total openings of 2,370 per year



● 2016 ○ 2030


