RE: Required Reports - Revised

The purpose of this memo is to provide a quick overview of required reports. In addition to the ongoing operating plan changes, program transfers, and budget amendments, a number of reports are due to either the Legislative Finance Committee (LFC) or the Legislative Fiscal Division (LFD) prior to the June LFC meeting. Other reports – Medicaid Monitoring, state chief information officer, and the HB 10 update on MMIS -- are separate agenda items and are separately discussed.

#### **OPERATING PLAN CHANGES AND PROGRAM TRANSFERS**

The Governor's Office submitted one program transfer and three operating plan changes for comment prior to approval. The program transfer would move state special revenue authority for FY 2016 and FY 2017 in the Department of Environmental Quality between programs because HB 2 had the funding in the wrong program. Funding is for the Orphan Share Expanded Usage (Restricted/Biennial/OTO) line item and is being moved from the Permitting & Compliance Division to the Remediation Division.

The three operating plan changes being held for LFC comment are all to move funding from the operating expenses category to the equipment category. All are being requested because the items being purchased would cost more than the capitalization threshold and need to be reported in the equipment category according to accounting standards.

The Governor's Office has also already approved one operating plan change, two house adjustments, and four program transfers as time sensitive.

Staff has not noted any concerns with the changes. The reports from the Office of Budget and Program Planning is attached.

#### **BUDGET AMENDMENTS**

As of June 5, 2015, the LFD received notification of 69 budget amendments certified by the Governor since the December 2015 LFC meeting totaling \$37.1 million in FY 2015. The report by Kris Wilkinson with the full listing is included separately.
