#### APPROVAL OF THE MINUTES OF THE PREVIOUS MEETING

00:00:01 **MOTION:** Sen. Keenan moved to approve the minutes of the previous meeting. Rep. Ballance noted a correction on page 5. **VOTE:** Minutes approved as amended.

# FYE 2016 BUDGET STATUS REPORT (Exhibit 1)

00:01:08 Amy Carlson, Director, Legislative Fiscal Division (LFD) presented the Budget Status Report. More discussion on the balance sheet will be in Volume 1.

# General Fund Revenue

00:09:01 Stephanie Morrison, Fiscal Analyst, LFD noted FY 2017 general fund revenues through the end of November were \$7.1 million or 0.9% ahead of FY 2016 revenues through the same period; this increase is below the anticipated growth of 3.4%. As the fiscal year progresses, the accruing data allows for a closer estimate of final collections based on historical collection patterns.

00:07:33 Kris Wilkinson, Fiscal Analyst, LFD summarized the budget and expenditure portion of the budget status report that discusses the FY 2017 appropriations and expenditures, FY 2017 HB 2 budget changes, supplemental requests, statutory appropriations, and HB 2 state resources by agency.

00:06:48 Sen. Sesso asked the reason for the supplemental request for the Office of Public Instruction. Rob Miller, Fiscal Analyst, LFD explained that revenue flowing into the guarantee account was lower than anticipated and ANB is higher than anticipated.

- 00:09:24 Rep. Dudik asked for information on the transfer in the Office of the Public Defender. Greg DeWitt, Fiscal Analyst, LFD explained the transfer of money from the second year to the first year was to make-up for shortfalls. The Office of the Public Defender requested the Office of Budget and Program Planning include them in the supplemental bill but they were declined and told to implement a mitigation plan.
- O0:12:18 Rep. Ballance asked what the supplemental for the Office of Higher Education (OCHE) is for and is it related to the transfer. Shauna Albrecht, Fiscal Analyst, LFD explained the supplemental for OCHE is for stem scholarships. These scholarships are funded out of the lottery revenues and for FY 2017 revenues fell short. Scholarships awarded for FY17 academic year are already funded.

# **THE MONTANA HELP ACT (Exhibit 2)**

O0:13:59 Quinn Holzer, Operations Manager, LFD presented the Montana Help Act, Medicaid Expansion Update. The HELP Act has been fully implemented, and Medicaid services are being delivered and paid for via 100% by federal funds at this time. This 100% match will be reduced to 95% as of January 1, 2017 to an eventual final federal matching rate of 90% (90% federal, 10% state) in 2020 and beyond. This report provides an update of the Medicaid expansion and the financial implications. Also included in the committee notebooks are the HELP-Link Workforce Program Report and HELP-Link information handout from the Department of Labor and Industry. (Exhibits 2a & 2b)

The table on page 1 illustrates the current status of the Medicaid appropriation for FY 2017. The legislative appropriations include HB 2 authorizations, including the continuation of biennial appropriations not used in FY 2016. Also included in the committee notebooks is a letter from Richard Opper, Director, Department of Public Health and Human services regarding services provided through the Senior and Long Term Care Division.
