As introduced, House Bill No. 824 (2007-Ingraham) would have exempted from state income tax all military retirement or pension income received by a retired member of the uniformed services of the United States, as defined in 10 U.S.C. 101, who has been honorably discharged from uniformed service; or all income received as survivor benefits under Title 10, chapter 73, of the United States Code, provided that the retired member was honorably discharged from uniformed service.
