Fiscal Analysis

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. There is a commission on legislation reform.
- 2. The commission must complete its work between July 1, 2001, and December 31, 2002.
- 3. House and Senate appointments to the commission are legislators who do not reside in Helena.
- 4. Three of the appointees of the Governor, the Attorney General, the State Auditor, the Secretary of State, and the Superintendent of Public Instruction reside in Helena. The remaining two appointees must travel to Helena for meetings of the commission.
- 5. HB 66 imposes significant workload increases on Legislative Services Division staff but requires staff to provide the services within existing resources. Staff will provide legal and secretarial support to the commission.

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- 6. The commission is required to identify obsolete, illogical, inconsistent, poorly organized, or unconstitutional laws and will conduct 4 one-day meetings and 2 two-day meetings in Helena to complete its duties. Costs shown in this fiscal note reflect the cost of travel and other expenses for these meetings.
- 7. The commission will issue a report to the 58^{th} Legislature.
- 8. The appropriation for the commission needs to be a biennial appropriation in FY 2002 placed in HB 2 in the Legislative Branch Interim Studies and Activities Program.
