ASSUMPTIONS:

1. There are eight new district court judges in the state.
2. Having new judges increases the recusal rate, so substitute judge call-in costs will increase.
3. This legislation expands the pool of substitute judges available to call-in.
4. Judges will increase their requests for substitute judges rather than incur the delays they must currently tolerate. A \$10,000 appropriation would allow district court judges statewide to call in judges for approximately 31 eight-hour days.
