## Fiscal Analysis

## ASSUMPTIONS:

1. For school year 2000, districts submitted reimbursement claims for 1,863 individual transportation contracts totaling 3,149,167 miles. The number of contracts and miles reported for school years 2002 and 2003 is not anticipated to increase or decrease from the number reported for school year 2000.
2. The cost of individual transportation contracts is paid one-half by counties and one-half by the state. The state's share of the proposed increased reimbursement rates for individual contract miles from the current 21.25 cents per mile to 32 cents per mile is $\$ 169,268$. [3,149,167 miles $x(.32-.2125) / 2=\$ 169,268$ ]

## EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

The cost of individual pupil transportation contracts is paid one-half by the county in which a district is located, and one-half by the state. Statewide, counties' share of the cost to increase reimbursements for individual contract miles from the current 21.25 cents per mile to 32 cents per mile is $\$ 169,268$. The source of funding is a permissive (non-voted) countywide property tax levy.

TECHNICAL NOTES:
HB 193 requires a general fund appropriation in HB 2 to the Office of Public Instruction.
