ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. HB 201 makes embezzlement a specific type of theft with a separate penalty provision, but the statute mirrors current theft language and penalties.
- 2. There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Corrections.
- 3. There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Justice.

EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

There will be significant local government impact. The average daily cost to house a person in a detention center would be \$75 to \$100. A six-month sentence would cost \$18,000.
