## Fiscal Analysis

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1. The Office of Public Instruction (OPI) will prepare and distribute the survey to 357 school systems annually. OPI will tabulate the results of the survey.
2. OPI is in the process of completing a non-fiscal data information system that can be used by the schools via the Internet.
3. If the legislature approves OPI's appropriation request for operating costs for this information system as requested in the Governor's budget, OPI can do this survey across the Internet at no additional cost.

### TECHNICAL NOTES:

1. It would be appropriate to adjust the reporting dates in this bill to require the survey to be mailed to districts in September and submitted to OPI by mid-October. These dates would be consistent with other reporting requirements for non-fiscal data.
2. Schools already meet the requirements of Section 1 (1)(d) through the Trustees Financial Summary (TFS). This requirement in HB384 is redundant and is out of sync with the requirement that the TFS be submitted by September 15.
