Fiscal Analysis

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The amount of revenue collected by the Board of Crime Control (BCC) is currently minimal, approximately \$300 a year. As more counties, cities, and towns initiate programs the revenue will be retained at the local level.
- 2 It is assumed that BCC will collect no additional revenue as a result of the increase in fines and fees.
- 3 Any revenue collected by BCC will be deposited in the general fund to offset general fund costs of the program. The account established in 53-9-109, MCA would be eliminated if SB 113 is passed and approved.
- 4 There is no fiscal impact to the Judiciary.
- 5 There is no fiscal impact to the Department of Justice.
- 6 There is no fiscal impact to the Montana Association of Counties.

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
