ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Payment for a Department of Justice (DOJ) attorney's time would be made through a memorandum of understanding between FWP and DOJ defining the services to be provided.
- 2. If a DOJ attorney were to be used in the prosecution of a criminal case started by a warden, FWP would be billed for the hours spent on the case at approximately \$40 per hour.
- 3. It is estimated that these cases would average 1,040 hours per year including case preparation, travel time, and district court retrials on appeal, for a total of \$41,600 per year.
