## **Department of Public Health and Human Services**

- 1. The Department of Public Health and Human Services (DPHHS) currently receives data on newborn hearing screening from hospitals on a voluntarily basis. This data is then passed on through the agency to the Federal Maternal Children Health block grant.
- 2. The DPHHS anticipates purchasing up to ten newborn hearing screening devices over the biennium for long-term loan placement in appropriate facilities.
- 3. The cost of the specialized equipment to perform newborn hearing screening is between \$6,000 and \$13,000, averaging \$10,000 per newborn hearing screening device.
- 4. Very few facilities in Montana can afford this equipment.
- 5. The purchase of ten newborn hearing screening devices over the biennium would cost \$100,000 (10 x \$10,000 = \$100,000 based on \$10,000 being the average cost per device).
- 6. Funding of \$100,000 is appropriated by this bill for the equipment from the state special revenue account, provided for in 53-19-310, the fund for telecommunications for people with disabilities.

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
