## Fiscal Analysis

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1. This is the only provision being considered. If other provisions are enacted, the cost associated with this provision may be different.
2. The number of volunteer firefighters will not increase significantly above the current level of 2,500.
3. No change will occur in retirement patterns.
4. The contributions from the Fire Insurance Premium Tax Fund will continue at the current rate of 5% of the premium taxes collected on certain fire risks.
5. The increased benefits will cost approximately \$900,000.
6. The contributions currently paid into the system are sufficient to fund the increased benefits.
