 Approximately 853,753 vehicles will be registered based on FY 2000 registrations and assessed the fee (853,753 X \$0.15 = \$128,063). Fiscal Note Request, <u>HB0524</u>, <u>As Introduced</u> Page 2 (continued)

- 2. About 2,643 vehicles will be abandoned each year based on national averages as determined by the Automobile Manufacturers Association and hauled at a cost of \$70 per vehicle.
- 3. The current abandoned vehicle reimbursement program will continue unchanged at \$70 per vehicle or $$185,010 (2,643 \times 70 = $185,010)$.
- 4. There will be no new or increased expenditures because this bill, as currently written, does not provide any additional appropriation or spending authority.
