Fiscal Analysis

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. Under current law, publicly owned golf courses may receive a retail beer and wine license regardless of the number of beer and wine licenses already issued within the beer and wine license quota area in which the golf course is situated.
- 2. Under this proposal, private golf courses, with exceptions, would be able to apply for a retail beer and wine license regardless of the number of beer and wine licenses already issued within the beer and wine license quota area in which the golf course is situated.
- 3. There will be minimal fiscal impact. Currently, there are 20 golf courses with all-beverage licenses; and 11 public courses with beer and wine licenses. General fund revenue would increase by \$200 for every private golf course that currently does not have a beer, wine, or all-beverage license that opts to acquire a golf course beer and wine license under this proposal.
