### **Fiscal Analysis**

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. The Montana Highway Patrol (MHP) made 100,000 traffic stops last year with 16% (16,000) ultimately having seatbelt activity.
- 2. The number of seatbelt contacts will increase by 20% each year. (1/3 written warnings, 2/3 citations)
- 3. The increase is approximately 2,100 new citations, while the other 1,000 will be written warnings.
- 4. If the current penalty remains, 2,100 citations times \$20 equals \$42,000 in revenue.
- 5. There will be \$21,000 deposited in the general fund and \$21,000 provided to local governments.

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6. The estimates used are conservative because there are too many unknown variables. For example, once the public is made aware of this violation being considered a "standard violation," there will be an automatic increase in compliance by the public.
