Fiscal Analysis

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The National Council on Compensation Insurance (NCCI) reviewed the legislation and estimated the impact on the workers' compensation system costs to be insignificant and to be less than 0.1%.
- 2. The State Fund, with a statutory requirement to be neither more nor less than self-supporting, sets its premium rates at a level sufficient to ensure adequate funding of the insurance program (39-71-2311, MCA). Therefore, an increase in benefits will be offset with an increase in premium rates.

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- 3. The State Fund is estimating net earned premium of \$75,217,000 for FY 2002. An increase in rates of 0.1% correlates to \$75,217.
- 4. The State Fund is estimating net earned premium of \$79,201,000 for FY 2003. An increase in rates of 0.1% correlates to \$79,201.
