Fiscal Analysis

ASSUMPTIONS:

- 1. The Legislative Council and Legislative Finance Committee will adopt policies requiring bill summaries be prepared as outlined in the legislation.
- 2. The workload related to preparation and production of the bill summaries for bills introduced prior to the 45th legislative day transmittal deadline cannot be absorbed within current staff resources.

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- 3. Workload related to the preparation and production of the bill summaries for bills introduced after the 45th legislative day transmittal deadline would be absorbed within current staff resources.
- 4. The Legislative Services Division will contract for services related to the preparation and production of the bill summaries for those bills introduced prior to the transmittal deadline.
- 5. There would be 1200 bills introduced prior to the 45th legislative day. Contract services would be required for approximately three months, and contract provisions would require a 24-hour turnaround period.
- 6. Each bill summary would require one hour of contracted service time to complete.
- 7. Contracted services, including all operational costs incurred producing the bill summaries, could be obtained at a cost of \$60 per hour.
- 8. The Legislative Branch's bill printing and distribution center would print the bill summaries for distribution during the legislative process at a cost of \$19,272.
- 9. Programming and operational costs related to placing the bill summaries on LAWS, the Legislative Automated Workflow System, would be absorbed within current budget.
- An appropriation of \$72,000 would be needed in the Legislative Services Division HB 2 budget for FY2003, and an appropriation of \$19,272 would be needed in the Legislative Services Division Program 22 Feed Bill Program in the 2003 session feed bill (HB1).
