## **Fiscal Analysis**

## **ASSUMPTIONS:**

- 1. The legislation authorizes meetings of standing committees prior to a special session for the purpose of holding hearings and taking action on pre-introduced legislation.
- 2. Special session business will be conducted with increased efficiency because committee business can be concluded prior to convening of the entire legislative body. The fiscal impact of the increased efficiencies is not identifiable.

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- 3. The legislation authorizes payment of salary and expense reimbursement as provided in 5-2-302 for members of the legislature engaged in pre-session business. This provision has no fiscal impact.
- 4. The legislation authorizes payment of salary and per diem as provided in 5-2-301 for members of the legislature for the day prior to the convening of a special session. This provision has no fiscal impact but increases the efficiency with which payment can be processed.
- 5. Costs related to a special session are budgeted in a special session feed bill and not included in the legislature's general session feed bill.
- 6. There is no identifiable fiscal impact from this legislation.
