## **Fiscal Analysis**

#### **ASSUMPTIONS:**

1. SB 307 will have no impact on state appropriations for direct state aid, guaranteed tax base aid, or state special education appropriations.

### EFFECT ON COUNTY OR OTHER LOCAL REVENUES OR EXPENDITURES:

Local property taxes will increase to the extent that local voters approve tax increases to support the higher budgets that are allowed under this bill. Local property taxes could increase by \$16.5 million in districts that are at or near the maximum budgets.

#### LONG-RANGE IMPACTS:

This bill may threaten the constitutional requirement of the state to provide equal educational opportunity.
