## Fiscal Analysis

### ASSUMPTIONS:

1. This bill provides for restricting the use of public funds to support or subsidize energy projects unless those projects were dedicated to in-state use at cost-based prices for customers with an individual load requirement of less than 1,000 kilowatts.
2. There is no revenue from any future major energy project included in current law revenue forecasts in HJR2.
3. This proposal does not apply to tax credits and deductions already authorized for existing energy projects.
4. This proposal has no impact on current law revenues or expenditures of the Department of Revenue.

### TECHNICAL NOTES:

1. Section 1 (1)(b) which would prohibit the legislature from providing any tax credits or deductions which could be taken by certain generation facilities may be in conflict with statutes authorizing such deductions and credits.
