13 OPTION OF DESIGNATING NO-PASSING ZONES; CLARIFYING THAT PROVISIONS GOVERNING

14 NO-PASSING ZONES DO NOT APPLY WHEN A VEHICLE IS MAKING CERTAIN TURNING MOVEMENTS;

15 PROVIDING FOR AND DEFINING ROUNDABOUTS; ALLOWING A PERSON TO CROSS DOUBLE YELLOW

16 LINES IF TURNING INTO A PRIVATE ROAD OR DRIVEWAY; PROHIBITING A PERSON FROM PARKING

17 A MOTOR VEHICLE IN A BICYCLE LANE; REGULATING TURNING WHERE A SPECIAL LANE HAS BEEN

18 DESIGNATED FOR MAKING LEFT TURNS; PROHIBITING THE OPERATOR OF A MOTOR VEHICLE FROM

19 INTERFERING WITH A BICYCLIST; MODIFYING THE PROVISIONS FOR STOPPING AT AND CROSSING

20 RAILROAD GRADE CROSSINGS; ALLOWING A MOTORCYCLIST TO DRIVE WITHOUT THE HEADLAMP

21 LIGHTED IF THE MOTORCYCLE IS BEING DRIVEN TO A REPAIR FACILITY; INCREASING THE FINE FOR

22 THROWING CONTAINERS OF URINE OR FECES ON A HIGHWAY TO \$1,000; PROHIBITING SHOOTING A

23 FIREARM FROM OR ACROSS THE RIGHT-OF-WAY OF ANY HIGHWAY; PROVIDING FOR THE

24 ESTABLISHMENT OF SCHOOL CROSSING GUARDS; AMENDING SECTIONS ~~45-5-205~~, 61-8-301, 61-8-303,

3 ~~Section 1.~~ Section 45-5-205, MCA, is amended to read:

4 ~~"45-5-205. Negligent vehicular assault -- penalty.~~ (1) A person who commits the offense of negligent  
5 vehicular assault if the person:

6 ~~(a) negligently operates a vehicle, other than a bicycle as defined in 61-1-123, while under the influence~~  
7 ~~of alcohol, a dangerous drug, any other drug, or any combination of the three, as provided for in 61-8-401(1),~~  
8 ~~and who causes bodily injury to another; or~~

9 ~~(b) causes bodily injury to another person while eluding a peace officer as provided in [section 2]~~  
10 ~~commits the offense of negligent vehicular assault.~~

11 ~~(2) Subject to subsection (3), a person convicted of the offense of negligent vehicular assault shall be~~  
12 ~~fined an amount not to exceed \$1,000 or incarcerated in a county jail for a term not to exceed 1 year, or both,~~  
13 ~~and shall be ordered to pay restitution as provided in 46-18-241.~~

14 ~~(3) A person convicted of the offense of negligent vehicular assault who caused serious bodily injury~~  
15 ~~to another shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$10,000 or incarcerated for a term not to exceed 10 years,~~  
16 ~~or both, and shall be ordered to pay restitution as provided in 46-18-241.~~

17 ~~(4) If a term of incarceration is imposed under subsection (2) or (3), the judge may suspend the term~~

21 ~~NEW SECTION. Section 2. Eluding a peace officer -- penalties -- definition.~~ (1) A person commits  
22 the offense of eluding a peace officer if the person, without causing bodily injury to another person, willfully fails  
23 to or refuses to bring the person's vehicle to a stop or otherwise attempts to elude a peace officer who is lawfully  
24 in pursuit and:

25 ~~(a) whose vehicle is at the time in compliance with the requirements of 61-9-402;~~

26 ~~(b) who has given a visual or audible signal for the person to stop; or~~

27 ~~(c) who is prominently displaying the officer's badge of office or identification.~~

28 ~~(2) A person who commits the offense of eluding a peace officer is subject to the penalty provided in~~  
29 ~~61-8-715.~~

30 ~~(3) If a person causes bodily injury to another person while engaged in eluding a peace officer, the~~

1 person is subject to the penalties provided in 45-5-205.

2 ~~—— (4) "Peace officer" has the same meaning as provided in 45-2-101.~~

4 **Section 1.** Section 61-8-301, MCA, is amended to read:

5 **"61-8-301. Reckless driving -- reckless endangerment of highway worker.** (1) A person commits  
6 the offense of reckless driving if the person:

7 (a) operates a vehicle in willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property;

8 ~~(b) operates a vehicle in willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property while fleeing~~  
9 ~~or attempting to flee from or elude a peace officer who is lawfully in pursuit and whose vehicle is at the time in~~  
10 ~~compliance with the requirements of 61-9-402; or~~

11 ~~(c)~~(b) operates a vehicle in willful or wanton disregard for the safety of persons or property while  
12 passing, in either direction, a school bus that has stopped and is displaying the visual flashing red signal, as  
13 provided in 61-8-351 and 61-9-402. This subsection ~~(1)(c)~~ (1)(b) does not apply to situations described in  
14 61-8-351(5).

15 (2) Each A municipality in this state may enact and enforce 61-8-715, ~~section 2~~, and subsection (1)  
16 of this section as an ordinance.

17 (3) A person who is convicted of the offense of reckless driving or of reckless endangerment of a  
18 highway worker is subject to the penalties provided in 61-8-715.

19 (4) (a) A person commits the offense of reckless endangerment of a highway worker if the person  
20 purposely, knowingly, or negligently drives a motor vehicle in a highway construction zone in a manner that  
21 endangers persons or property or if the person purposely removes, ignores, or intentionally strikes an official  
22 traffic control device in a construction zone for reasons other than:

23 (i) avoidance of an obstacle;

24 (ii) an emergency; or

25 (iii) to protect the health and safety of an occupant of the vehicle or of another person.

26 (b) As used in this section:

27 (i) "construction zone" has the same meaning as is provided in 61-8-314; and

28 (ii) "highway worker" means an employee of the department of transportation, a local authority, a utility  
29 company, or a private contractor."

1           **Section 2.** Section 61-8-303, MCA, is amended to read:

2           **"61-8-303. Speed restrictions.** (1) Except as provided in 61-8-309, 61-8-310, 61-8-312, and subsection  
3 (2) of this section, the speed limit for vehicles traveling:

4           (a) on a federal-aid interstate highway outside an urbanized area of 50,000 population or more is 75  
5 miles an hour at all times and the speed limit for vehicles traveling on federal-aid interstate highways within an  
6 urbanized area of 50,000 population or more is 65 miles an hour at all times;

7           (b) on any other public highway of this state is 70 miles an hour during the daytime and 65 miles an hour  
8 during the nighttime;

9           (c) in an urban district is 25 miles an hour.

10          (2) The speed limit for vehicles traveling on U.S. highway 93 between the Canadian and Idaho borders  
11 is 65 miles an hour at all times. The speed limit imposed by this subsection ceases to be effective if U.S.  
12 highway 93 is upgraded to a continuous four-lane highway.

13          (3) A vehicle subject to the speed limits imposed in subsection (1) traveling on a two-lane road may  
14 exceed the speed limits imposed in subsection (1) by 10 miles an hour in order to overtake and pass a vehicle  
15 and return safely to the right-hand lane.

16          (4) Subject to the maximum speed limits set forth in subsections (1) and (2), a person shall operate a  
17 vehicle in a careful and prudent manner and at a reduced rate of speed no greater than is reasonable and  
18 prudent under the conditions existing at the point of operation, taking into account the amount and character of  
19 traffic, visibility, weather, and roadway conditions.

20          (5) ~~When no~~ Except when a special hazard exists that requires lower speed for compliance with  
21 ~~subsections (1) and (2)~~ subsection (4), the speed of a vehicle not in excess of the limits specified in this section  
22 and in 61-8-312 or established as authorized in 61-8-309 through 61-8-311 and 61-8-313 is lawful, but a speed  
23 in excess of 25 miles an hour in an urban district is unlawful are the maximum lawful speeds allowed.

24          (6) "Daytime" means from one-half hour before sunrise to one-half hour after sunset. "Nighttime" means  
25 at any other hour.

26          (7) The speed limits set forth in this section may be altered by the transportation commission or a local  
27 authority as authorized in 61-8-309, 61-8-310, 61-8-313, and 61-8-314."

30 ~~"61-8-308. Permission of authorities to hold speed contest -- definition. (1) No A race or contest~~

1 for speed shall ~~speed contest ON A HIGHWAY AS DEFINED IN 61-1-201~~ may not be held and no a person shall ~~may~~  
 2 ~~not~~ engage in, or aid, or abet in any motor vehicle speed contest or exhibition of speed on a public highway or  
 3 street ~~ON A HIGHWAY AS DEFINED IN 61-1-201~~ without written permission of the authorities of the state, county, or  
 4 city having jurisdiction and unless the same ~~contest~~ is fully and efficiently patrolled for the entire distance over  
 5 which such ~~the~~ race or contest for speed ~~contest~~ is to be held.

6 ~~—— (2) For the purposes of this section, "speed contest" means the use of one or more vehicles in an~~

13 ~~—— (3) A violation of this section is punishable as provided in 61-8-717."~~

15 **Section 3.** Section 61-8-311, MCA, is amended to read:

16 **"61-8-311. Minimum speed regulations.** (1) A person may not drive a motor vehicle at a speed slow  
 17 enough to impede or block the normal and reasonable movement of traffic except when reduced speed is  
 18 necessary for safe operation or in compliance with law.

19 (2) On a two-lane highway where passing is unsafe because of oncoming traffic ~~in the opposite direction~~  
 20 or other conditions, the operator of a slow-moving vehicle, ~~including a passenger vehicle,~~ behind which four or  
 21 more vehicles are formed in line shall turn off the roadway at the nearest ~~place designated as a turnout by signs~~  
 22 ~~erected by the authority having jurisdiction over the highway or wherever sufficient area for a~~ where a sufficient  
 23 and safe turnout exists in order to permit the vehicles following it to proceed. If the shoulder of the highway to  
 24 the right of the ~~overtaken slow-moving~~ vehicle is wide enough and is in a condition allowing safe travel, the ~~driver~~  
 25 operator of the ~~overtaken slow-moving~~ vehicle may drive onto the shoulder and proceed at a safe speed until  
 26 passed. As used in this section, a slow-moving vehicle is one ~~which that~~ is proceeding at a rate of speed less  
 27 than the normal flow of traffic at the particular time and place. The department of transportation is authorized  
 28 to designate and construct ~~such~~ turnouts and to erect ~~signs~~ official traffic control devices at appropriate places  
 29 advising motorists of this statute.

30 (3) If the department of transportation or local authorities within their respective jurisdictions determine

1 on the basis of an engineering and traffic investigation that slow speeds on any part of a highway ~~consistently~~  
 2 impede the normal and reasonable movement of traffic, the commission or the local authority may set a  
 3 minimum speed limit below which a person may not ~~drive~~ operate a vehicle except when necessary for safe  
 4 operation or in compliance with law."

5

6 **Section 4.** Section 61-8-312, MCA, is amended to read:

7 **"61-8-312. Special speed limitations on trucks, truck tractors, and motor-driven cycles.** (1) Except  
 8 as provided in 61-8-303, 61-8-309, 61-8-310, and subsection (2) of this section, the speed limit for a truck or  
 9 truck tractor of more than 1 ton "manufacturer's rated capacity" traveling on:

10 (a) ~~completed sections of a federal-aid~~ interstate highway is 65 miles an hour; and

11 (b) ~~four-lane divided highways and completed sections of primary and secondary highways~~ any other  
 12 public highway is 60 miles an hour during the daytime and 55 miles an hour during the nighttime as those terms  
 13 are defined in 61-8-303.

14 (2) Except as provided in 61-8-303, 61-8-309, and 61-8-310, the speed limit for a vehicle subject to a  
 15 term permit under 61-10-124(2)(d) or a truck-trailer-trailer or truck tractor-semitrailer-trailer-trailer combination  
 16 of vehicles subject to special permits under 61-10-124(4) is 55 miles an hour unless otherwise stated in the  
 17 permit.

18 (3) A person may not operate a motor-driven cycle at any time mentioned in 61-9-201 at a speed greater  
 19 than 35 miles an hour unless the motor-driven cycle is equipped with a headlamp or lamps that are adequate  
 20 to reveal a person or vehicle at a distance of 300 feet ahead."

21

22 **NEW SECTION. Section 5. Right-of-way for vehicles engaged in mobile highway maintenance.**

23 The operator of a vehicle shall yield the right-of-way to an authorized vehicle that is engaged in highway  
 24 maintenance activities when the authorized vehicle is displaying flashing lights that meet the requirements of  
 25 the department of transportation.

26

27 **Section 6.** Section 61-8-321, MCA, is amended to read:

28 **"61-8-321. Drive on right side of roadway -- exceptions.** (1) Upon all roadways of sufficient width,  
 29 a vehicle ~~shall~~ must be ~~driven~~ operated upon the right half of the roadway, except as follows:

30 (a) when overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction under the rules

1 governing ~~such the passing~~ movement;

2 (b) when the right half of a roadway is closed to traffic while under construction or repair;

3 (c) upon a roadway divided into three marked lanes for traffic under the rules applicable ~~thereon; or on~~  
4 a divided roadway;

5 (d) upon a roadway designated ~~and signposted~~ by official traffic control devices for one-way traffic;

6 (e) when the operator of a vehicle is complying with the provisions of 61-8-346; or

7 (f) when an obstruction exists that makes it necessary to drive to the left of the center of the roadway.

8 (2) A person operating a vehicle to the left of the center of the roadway for any of the reasons provided  
9 in subsection (1) shall yield the right-of-way to all vehicles traveling in the proper direction upon the unobstructed  
10 portion of the roadway that are within a distance that constitutes an immediate hazard.

11 ~~(2)(3) Upon all roadways any~~ A vehicle proceeding at less than the normal speed of traffic at the time  
12 and place and under the conditions then existing ~~shall~~ must be ~~driven~~ operated in the right-hand lane then  
13 available for traffic, or as close as practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway except when  
14 overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction or when preparing for a left turn at an  
15 intersection or into a private road or driveway."

16

17 **Section 7.** Section 61-8-323, MCA, is amended to read:

18 **"61-8-323. Overtaking vehicle on left.** The following rules govern the overtaking and passing of  
19 vehicles proceeding in the same direction, subject to the limitations, exceptions, and special rules provided in  
20 this ~~part~~ chapter:

21 (1) The ~~driver~~ operator of a vehicle overtaking another vehicle proceeding in the same direction shall  
22 pass to the left of the other vehicle at a safe distance and may not again drive to the right side of the roadway  
23 until safely clear of the overtaken vehicle.

24 (2) Except when overtaking and passing on the right is permitted, the ~~driver~~ operator of an overtaken  
25 vehicle shall give way to the right in favor of the overtaking vehicle upon an audible signal or the use of signal  
26 lamps, as provided in 61-9-218, and may not increase the speed of the vehicle until completely passed by the  
27 overtaking vehicle. When giving way to the right on a two-lane highway, the ~~driver~~ operator of the vehicle being  
28 overtaken may travel upon the shoulder at a safe speed until passed if the shoulder is wide enough and is in  
29 a condition allowing safe travel."

30

1           **Section 8.** Section 61-8-324, MCA, is amended to read:

2           "**61-8-324. ~~When overtaking~~ Overtaking vehicle on right is permitted.** (1) The ~~driver~~ operator of a  
3 vehicle may overtake and pass upon the right of another vehicle only under the following conditions:

4           (a) when the vehicle overtaken is making or about to make a left turn; or

5           (b) upon a ~~street or highway~~ roadway with unobstructed pavement ~~not occupied by parked vehicles~~ of  
6 sufficient width for two or more ~~lines~~ lanes of ~~moving~~ vehicles moving lawfully in ~~each~~ the direction being  
7 traveled by the overtaking vehicle;

8 ~~—— (c) upon a one-way street, or upon any roadway on which traffic is restricted to one direction of~~  
9 ~~movement, where the roadway is free from obstructions and of sufficient width for two or more lines of moving~~  
10 ~~vehicles.~~

11           (2) The ~~driver~~ operator of a vehicle may overtake and pass another vehicle upon the right only under  
12 conditions permitting ~~such movement in safety~~ safe movement. ~~In no event shall such~~ The movement may not  
13 be made by driving off the pavement or main-traveled portion of the roadway."

14

15           **Section 9.** Section 61-8-325, MCA, is amended to read:

16           "**61-8-325. Limitations on overtaking on the left.** (1) ~~No~~ A vehicle ~~shall~~ may not be driven to the left  
17 side of the center of the roadway in overtaking and passing another vehicle proceeding in the same direction  
18 unless ~~such~~ the left side is clearly visible and is free of oncoming traffic for a sufficient distance ahead to permit  
19 ~~such~~ the overtaking and passing to be completely made without interfering with the safe operation of any vehicle  
20 approaching from the opposite direction or any vehicle overtaken. ~~In every event the overtaking vehicle must~~  
21 ~~return to the right-hand side of the roadway before coming within 100 feet of any vehicle approaching from the~~  
22 ~~opposite direction.~~

23           (2) ~~No~~ A vehicle ~~shall at any time~~ may not be driven to the left side of the roadway under the following  
24 conditions:

25           (a) when approaching the crest of a grade or upon a curve in the highway where the driver's view is  
26 obstructed within ~~such a~~ a distance ~~as to create~~ that creates a hazard in the event that another vehicle might  
27 approach from the opposite direction;

28           (b) when approaching within 100 feet of or traversing any intersection or railroad grade crossing, unless  
29 otherwise indicated by an official traffic control device; or

30           (c) when the view is obstructed upon approaching within 100 feet of any bridge, viaduct, or tunnel.



1 (3) The ~~foregoing~~ limitations ~~shall~~ provided in this section do not apply upon a one-way roadway."

3 **Section 10.** Section 61-8-326, MCA, is amended to read:

4 **"61-8-326. No-passing zones.** (1) The department of transportation and local authorities may  
5 determine those portions of a highway in their respective jurisdictions where overtaking and passing or driving  
6 to the left of the center of the roadway would be especially hazardous, and it they may by ~~appropriate signs or~~  
7 ~~markings~~ official traffic control devices on the ~~roadway~~ highway indicate the beginning and end of these zones.  
8 When the ~~signs or markings~~ official traffic control devices are in place and clearly visible to an ordinarily  
9 observant person, ~~every driver~~ an operator of a vehicle shall obey the directions of those ~~signs~~ devices.

10 (2) Where ~~signs or markings~~ official traffic control devices are in place to define a no-passing zone as  
11 set forth in subsection (1) ~~a driver~~ an operator of a vehicle may not drive on the left side of the roadway within  
12 the no-passing zone or on the left side of a pavement striping designed to mark the no-passing zone throughout  
13 its length.

14 (3) The provisions of this section do not apply under the conditions provided in 61-8-321(1) or to the  
15 operator of a vehicle that is turning left into or from an alley, private road, or driveway."

16  
17 **Section 11.** Section 61-8-327, MCA, is amended to read:

18 **"61-8-327. One-way roadways, and rotary traffic islands, and roundabouts.** (1) The department  
19 of transportation or a local authority may designate a highway, ~~or a separate~~ roadway, part of a roadway, or  
20 specific lanes under its ~~jurisdiction~~ respective jurisdiction for one-way traffic and shall erect ~~appropriate signs~~  
21 official traffic control devices giving notice of that designation.

22 (2) Upon a roadway designated ~~and signposted~~ by official traffic control devices for one-way traffic a  
23 vehicle may be driven only in the direction designated.

24 (3) A vehicle passing around a rotary traffic island or a roundabout may be driven only to the right of  
25 ~~such the~~ island or the center of the roundabout.

26 (4) For the purposes of this section, a "roundabout" is a circular intersection where all entering traffic  
27 must yield to the vehicles within the intersection."

28  
29 **Section 12.** Section 61-8-328, MCA, is amended to read:

30 **"61-8-328. Driving on roadways laned for traffic.** Whenever a roadway has been divided into two or

1 more clearly marked lanes for traffic, the following rules, in addition to all other consistent rules, apply:

2 (1) A vehicle must be ~~driven~~ operated as nearly as practicable entirely within a single lane and may not  
3 be moved from the lane until the ~~driver~~ operator has first ascertained that the movement can be made with  
4 safety.

5 (2) Upon a roadway that is divided into three lanes and that provides for two-way movement of traffic,  
6 a vehicle may not be ~~driven~~ operated in the center lane except:

7 (a) when overtaking and passing another vehicle ~~where the roadway is clearly visible~~ traveling in the  
8 same direction where passing is allowed and where the center lane is clear of traffic within a safe distance;

9 (b) ~~in preparation for a left turn; or~~

10 (c) ~~(b)~~ when the center lane is at the time allocated exclusively to traffic moving in the direction that the  
11 vehicle is proceeding and ~~is signposted to give notice of the allocation~~ is designated by official traffic control  
12 devices.

13 (3) Official ~~signs~~ traffic control devices may be erected directing ~~slow-moving~~ specified traffic to use a  
14 designated lane or designating those lanes to be used by traffic moving in a particular direction regardless of  
15 the center of the roadway. ~~Drivers~~ Operators of vehicles shall obey the directions of every official ~~sign~~ traffic  
16 control device that designates use of specific lanes.

17 (4) A person may turn a vehicle left across a lane marked with two yellow lines into a public or private  
18 parking lot, private road, private driveway, or a roadway if the turn can be made safely and if the person does  
19 not hinder the flow of oncoming traffic.

20 (5) Official traffic control devices may be installed that prohibit the changing of lanes on sections of a  
21 roadway, and operators of vehicles shall obey the directions of those devices.

22 (6) A motor vehicle may not be driven or parked in a bicycle lane that is signed and delineated as a

7 assistance at a hazard on the highway that necessitates the obstruction of a portion or all of the roadway, place  
8 at least two warning signs as required in this section as soon as is practicable under the circumstances. Flag  
9 persons and cones may be used to augment the warning signs.

10 (2) Highway warning signs must be of a uniform type, with dimensions of 3 x 3 feet, lettering 5 inches  
11 high, and reflectorized orange background and black border, as prescribed by the department. The signs must  
12 be designed to be visible both during the day and at night. The warning signs must bear the words "hazard  
13 ahead", "lane closed ahead", "road closed ahead", "wreck ahead", "tow truck ahead", or "wrecker ahead", as  
14 prescribed by the department.

15 (3) The operator of a commercial tow truck used for the purpose of rendering assistance at a hazard  
16 on the highway that necessitates the obstruction of a portion of the roadway shall place a highway warning sign  
17 as required in subsection (2):

18 (a) in an area in which the posted speed limit is 45 miles an hour or less, not less than 600 feet in  
19 advance of the hazard and an equal distance to the rear of the hazard; and

20 (b) in an area in which the posted speed limit is more than 45 miles an hour or no speed limit is posted,  
21 1,000 feet in advance of the hazard, except on a divided highway where the hazard does not cause disruption  
22 of traffic traveling on the opposite side of the divided highway, and an equal distance to the rear of the hazard.

23 (4) A local government unit may adopt an ordinance exempting an operator of a commercial tow truck  
24 from the requirements of subsection (2) within the limits of an incorporated city or town.

25 (5) When a hazard exists on the highway during the hours of darkness, the operator of a commercial  
26 tow truck called to render assistance shall place warning signs upon the highway as prescribed in this section  
27 and shall also place at least one red flare, red lantern, or warning light or reflector in close proximity to each  
28 warning sign.

29 (6) A violation of warning signs placed as provided in subsection (3) is considered reckless  
30 endangerment of a highway workers worker, as provided in ~~61-8-345~~ 61-8-301(4), and is punishable as provided

1 in ~~61-8-715(2)~~ 61-8-715."

3 NEW SECTION. Section 49. School crossing guards. (1) The trustees of a school district or the  
4 administration of a private school may organize and supervise school crossing guards for a school under their  
5 authority.

6 (2) The department of justice shall, in cooperation with the superintendent of public instruction and in  
7 accordance with the sign manual adopted by the department of transportation, prescribe by rule the  
8 identification, training requirements, and operation of school crossing guards.

9 (3) The purpose of school crossing guards is to influence and encourage pupils of the school to refrain  
10 from crossing public highways at points other than regular crossings, to direct pupils as to where and when to  
11 cross highways, and to direct traffic when pupils are crossing highways at regular crossings.

22 (a) ~~Right turns.~~ Both the approach for a right turn and a right turn ~~shall~~ must be made as close as  
23 practicable to the right-hand curb or edge of the roadway.

24 (b) ~~Left turn on two-way roadways.~~ At any an intersection where traffic is permitted to move in both  
25 directions on each roadway entering the intersection, an approach for a left turn ~~shall~~ must be made in that  
26 portion of the right half of the roadway nearest the center line ~~thereof of the roadway~~ and by passing to the right  
27 of ~~such the~~ center line where it enters the intersection, ~~and after~~ After entering the intersection, the left turn ~~shall~~  
28 must be made so as to leave the intersection to the right of the center line of the roadway being entered.  
29 Whenever practicable the left turn ~~shall~~ must be made in that portion of the intersection to the left of the center  
30 of the intersection.

1           (c) ~~Left turns on other than two-way roadways.~~ At any an intersection where traffic is restricted to one  
 2 direction on one or more of the roadways, the ~~driver~~ operator of a vehicle intending to turn left ~~at any such~~  
 3 ~~intersection~~ shall approach the intersection in the extreme left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic moving in  
 4 the direction of travel of ~~such the~~ vehicle, ~~and after~~ After entering the intersection the left turn ~~shall~~ must be made  
 5 so as to leave the intersection, as nearly as practicable, in the left-hand lane lawfully available to traffic moving  
 6 in ~~such the~~ direction upon the roadway being entered.

7           (d) A person making a turn under ~~subsections~~ subsection (1)(a), (1)(b), or (1)(c) is entitled to the full use  
 8 of the lane from which the turn may be legally made.

9           (2) (a) A person operating a bicycle who intends to turn left shall follow the course described in  
 10 subsection (1) or in subsection (2)(b).

11           (b) A person operating a bicycle who intends to turn left shall approach the turn as close as practicable  
 12 to the right curb or edge of the roadway. After proceeding across the intersecting roadway, the person shall  
 13 make the turn as close as practicable to the curb or edge of the roadway on the far right side of the intersection.  
 14 After turning, the person shall yield to through traffic and shall comply with any official traffic control device or  
 15 police officer regulating traffic on the highway along which ~~he~~ the person intends to proceed.

16           (3) Local authorities in their respective jurisdictions may ~~cause markers, buttons, or signs to be placed~~  
 17 place official traffic control devices within or adjacent to intersections, directing ~~and thereby require and direct~~  
 18 that a different course from that specified in this section be traveled by vehicles turning at an intersection, ~~and~~  
 19 ~~when markers, buttons, or signs are so placed no driver~~ Where official traffic control devices that direct a  
 20 different course are placed, the operator of a vehicle ~~shall~~ may not turn ~~a the~~ vehicle ~~at an intersection~~ other than  
 21 as directed ~~and required by such markers, buttons, or signs~~ by the official traffic control devices.

22           (4) Where a special lane has been indicated by official traffic control devices allowing operators of  
 23 vehicles proceeding in opposite directions to make left turns:

24           (a) a left turn may not be made from any other lane; and

25           (b) a vehicle may not be operated in the lane except when making a left turn from or onto the roadway  
 26 or when making a U-turn when that movement is permitted by law.""; AND

27           (B) 61-8-338 MUST READ AS FOLLOWS:

28           "**Section 23.** Section 61-8-338, MCA, is amended to read:

29           "**61-8-338. Method of giving hand-and-arm signals.** (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), all  
 30 signals ~~herein~~ required in this part that are given by hand and arm ~~shall~~ must be given from the left side of the



1 vehicle by the operator of the vehicle in the following manner ~~and such signals shall indicate as follows:~~

2 (a) ~~Left~~ For a left turn, Hand the operator's hand and arm must be extended horizontally.

3 (b) ~~Right~~ For a right turn, Hand the operator's hand and ~~arm~~ forearm must be extended upward.

4 (c) ~~Stop~~ For a stop or a decrease in speed, Hand the operator's hand and arm must be extended  
5 downward.

6 (2) The person operating a bicycle may signal a right turn by extending the right hand and arm
