

HOUSE BILL NO. 228

INTRODUCED BY M. LANGE

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4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING THAT COAL TAX REVENUE THAT IS COLLECTED  
5 BY THE STATE IN EXCESS OF THE AMOUNT REQUIRED TO BE DEPOSITED IN THE COAL TAX TRUST  
6 FUND PURSUANT TO ARTICLE IX, SECTION 5, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION AND THAT EXCEEDS  
7 THE AMOUNT OF COAL TAX REVENUE ESTIMATED TO BE RECEIVED IN EACH FISCAL YEAR IN THE  
8 STATE'S REVENUE ESTIMATING RESOLUTION BE DEPOSITED INTO A STATE SPECIAL REVENUE  
9 ACCOUNT FOR APPROPRIATION BY THE LEGISLATURE TO FUND K-12 EDUCATION; AMENDING  
10 SECTION 15-35-108, MCA; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE AND AN APPLICABILITY  
11 DATE."

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13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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15 NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Excess coal revenue used to fund K-12 education.** (1) There is an  
16 excess coal revenue state special revenue account.

17 (2) Coal tax revenue that is collected by the state in excess of the amount required to be deposited in  
18 the coal tax trust fund pursuant to Article IX, section 5, of the Montana constitution and that exceeds the amount  
19 of coal tax revenue estimated to be received in each fiscal year in the state's revenue estimating resolution must  
20 be deposited into the account created in subsection (1) to be appropriated by the legislature to fund K-12  
21 education.

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23 **Section 2.** Section 15-35-108, MCA, is amended to read:

24 **"15-35-108. (Temporary) Disposal of severance taxes.** Severance taxes collected under this chapter  
25 must, in accordance with the provisions of 15-1-501, be allocated as follows:

26 (1) Fifty percent of total coal severance tax collections is allocated to the trust fund created by Article  
27 IX, section 5, of the Montana constitution. The trust fund money must be deposited in the fund established under  
28 17-6-203(6) and invested by the board of investments as provided by law.

29 (2) ~~For~~ Subject to [section 1], for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the amount of 10% and for fiscal  
30 years beginning on or after July 1, 2003, the amount of 12% of coal severance tax collections is allocated to the

1 long-range building program account established in 17-7-205.

2 (3) ~~For~~ Subject to [section 1], for the fiscal year ending June 30, 2003, the amount of 6.01% and for  
3 fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2003, the amount of 7.75% must be credited to an account in the state  
4 special revenue fund to be allocated by the legislature for local impacts, provision of basic library services for  
5 the residents of all counties through library federations and for payment of the costs of participating in regional  
6 and national networking, conservation districts, and the Montana Growth Through Agriculture Act. Expenditures  
7 of the allocation may be made only from this account. Money may not be transferred from this account to another  
8 account other than the general fund. Any unreserved fund balance at the end of each fiscal year must be  
9 deposited in the general fund.

10 (4) ~~For~~ Subject to [section 1], for fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2003, the amount of 1.27%  
11 must be allocated to a permanent fund account for the purpose of parks acquisition or management. Income  
12 from this permanent fund account, excluding unrealized gains and losses, must be appropriated for the  
13 acquisition, development, operation, and maintenance of any sites and areas described in 23-1-102.

14 (5) ~~The~~ Subject to [section 1], the amount of 0.95% must be allocated to the debt service fund type to  
15 the credit of the renewable resource loan debt service fund.

16 (6) ~~For~~ Subject to [section 1], for fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2003, the amount of 0.63%  
17 must be allocated to a trust fund for the purpose of protection of works of art in the capitol and for other cultural  
18 and aesthetic projects. Income from this trust fund, excluding unrealized gains and losses, must be appropriated  
19 for protection of works of art in the state capitol and for other cultural and aesthetic projects.

20 (7) (a) Subject to subsections (7)(b) and (7)(c) and [section 1], all other revenue from severance taxes  
21 collected under the provisions of this chapter must be credited to the general fund of the state.

22 (b) The interest income from \$140 million of the coal severance tax permanent fund that is deposited  
23 in the general fund is statutorily appropriated, as provided in 17-7-502, on an annual basis as follows:

24 (i) \$65,000 to the cooperative development center;

25 (ii) for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, \$1.25 million, for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002,  
26 \$925,000, and for fiscal years beginning on or after July 1, 2003, \$1.25 million for the growth through agriculture  
27 program provided for in Title 90, chapter 9;

28 (iii) to the department of commerce:

29 (A) \$125,000 for a small business development center;

30 (B) \$50,000 for a small business innovative research program;

1 (C) except for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, \$425,000 for certified communities;  
 2 (D) \$200,000 for the Montana manufacturing extension center at Montana state university-Bozeman;  
 3 and  
 4 (E) \$300,000 for export trade enhancement;  
 5 (iv) \$175,000 to the office of economic development for business recruitment and retention; and  
 6 (v) \$600,000 to the department of administration for the purpose of reimbursing tax increment financing  
 7 industrial districts as provided in 7-15-4299. Reimbursement must be made to qualified districts on a proportional  
 8 basis to the loss of taxable value as a result of Chapter 285, Laws of 1999, and as documented by the  
 9 department of revenue. This documentation must be provided to the budget director and to the legislative fiscal  
 10 analyst. The reimbursement may not be used to pay debt service on tax increment bonds to the extent that the  
 11 bonds are secured by a guaranty, a letter of credit, or a similar arrangement provided by or on behalf of an owner  
 12 of property within the district.

13 (c) For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2001, there is transferred from the interest income referred to  
 14 in subsection (7)(b) \$4.85 million to the research and commercialization state special revenue account created  
 15 in 90-3-1002. For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 2002, there is transferred from the interest income referred  
 16 to in subsection (7)(b) \$3.165 million to the research and commercialization state special revenue account  
 17 created in 90-3-1002. Beginning July 1, 2003, there is transferred annually from the interest income referred to  
 18 in subsection (7)(b) \$3.65 million to the research and commercialization state special revenue account created  
 19 in 90-3-1002. (Terminates June 30, 2005--sec. 10(2), Ch. 10, Sp. L. May 2000; sec. 8(1), Ch. 12, Sp. L. August  
 20 2002.)

21 **15-35-108. (Effective July 1, 2005) Disposal of severance taxes.** Severance taxes collected under  
 22 this chapter must, in accordance with the provisions of 15-1-501, be allocated as follows:

23 (1) Fifty percent of total coal severance tax collections is allocated to the trust fund created by Article  
 24 IX, section 5, of the Montana constitution. The trust fund money must be deposited in the fund established under  
 25 17-6-203(6) and invested by the board of investments as provided by law.

26 (2) ~~Twelve percent~~ Subject to [section 1], 12% of coal severance tax collections is allocated to the  
 27 long-range building program account established in 17-7-205.

28 (3) ~~The~~ Subject to [section 1], the amount of 7.75% must be credited to an account in the state special  
 29 revenue fund to be allocated by the legislature for local impacts, provision of basic library services for the  
 30 residents of all counties through library federations and for payment of the costs of participating in regional and

1 national networking, conservation districts, and the Montana Growth Through Agriculture Act. Expenditures of  
2 the allocation may be made only from this account. Money may not be transferred from this account to another  
3 account other than the general fund. Any unreserved fund balance at the end of each fiscal year must be  
4 deposited in the general fund.

5 (4) ~~The~~ Subject to [section 1], the amount of 1.27% must be allocated to a permanent fund account for  
6 the purpose of parks acquisition or management. Income from this permanent fund account, excluding  
7 unrealized gains and losses, must be appropriated for the acquisition, development, operation, and maintenance  
8 of any sites and areas described in 23-1-102.

9 (5) ~~The~~ Subject to [section 1], the amount of 0.95% must be allocated to the debt service fund type to  
10 the credit of the renewable resource loan debt service fund.

11 (6) ~~The~~ Subject to [section 1], the amount of 0.63% must be allocated to a trust fund for the purpose  
12 of protection of works of art in the capitol and for other cultural and aesthetic projects. Income from this trust fund  
13 account, excluding unrealized gains and losses, must be appropriated for protection of works of art in the state  
14 capitol and for other cultural and aesthetic projects.

15 (7) ~~All~~ Subject to [section 1], all other revenue from severance taxes collected under the provisions of  
16 this chapter must be credited to the general fund of the state."

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18 **NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction.** [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an  
19 integral part of Title 20, chapter 9, part 5, and the provisions of Title 20, chapter 9, part 5, apply to [section 1].

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21 **NEW SECTION. Section 4. Effective date -- applicability.** [This act] is effective on passage and  
22 approval and applies to coal tax revenue collected on or after [the effective date of this act].
