4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT PROHIBITING THE EXPENDITURE OF PUBLIC FUNDS ON
5	PLAYGROUND EQUIPMENT AND PLAYGROUND SURFACING THAT DOES NOT COMPLY WITH THE
6	GUIDELINES ADOPTED BY THE UNITED STATES CONSUMER PRODUCT SAFETY COMMISSION; AND
7	PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

9	WHEREAS, each year hundreds of thousands of children in this country are injured on playgrounds,
10	according to the American Academy of Orthopedic Surgeons; and
11	WHEREAS, approximately 150,000 of those injuries are serious; and
12	WHEREAS, an average of 15 children die each year in playground accidents; and
13	WHEREAS, it is a matter of statewide interest and concern that playgrounds and playground equipment
14	should be safe for both able-bodied and disabled children.
15	
16	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
17	
18	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Use of public funds for purchase and installation of playground
19	equipment and surfacing definitions. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), on or after July 1, 2003,
20	public funds may not be used to:
21	(a) purchase playground equipment that does not substantially comply with the guidelines adopted by
22	the United States consumer product safety commission and published in the Handbook for Public Playground
23	Safety;
24	(b) purchase surfacing for the area under and around playground equipment that does not substantially
25	comply with the guidelines adopted by the United States consumer product safety commission and published
26	in the Handbook for Public Playground Safety; or
27	(c) install playground equipment or surfacing that does not substantially comply with the guidelines
28	adopted by the United States consumer product safety commission and published in the Handbook for Public
29	Playground Safety.
30	(2) Public funds may be used for the maintenance of playground equipment or surfacing installed before

1	July 1, 2003, even if the playground equipment or surfacing does not substantially comply with the guidelines
2	adopted by the United States consumer product safety commission and published in the Handbook for Public
3	Playground Safety.
4	(3) As used in this section the following definitions apply:
5	(a) (i) "Playground equipment" means a fabricated structure that is anchored to or built into the ground
6	at a playground and intended primarily for use by children.
7	(ii) The term does not include home playground equipment, amusement park equipment, sports
8	equipment, or fitness equipment.
9	(b) "Public funds" means funds spent by state government, a county, a city, a town, or a school district.
10	
11	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section1] is intended to be codified as an
12	integral part of Title 50, chapter 30, and the provisions of Title 50, chapter 30, apply to [section 1].

14	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. [This act] is effective on passage and approval.
