4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT REQUIRING <u>ALLOWING</u> REQUIRING A CURRENT OR FORMER
5	EMPLOYER TO PROVIDE A REQUESTING LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WITH EMPLOYMENT
6	INFORMATION RELATING TO A CURRENT OR FORMER EMPLOYEE SEEKING A PEACE OFFICER
7	POSITION WITH THE AGENCY; AND PROVIDING LIMITED IMMUNITY FROM CIVIL DAMAGES FOR
8	PRIVATE EMPLOYERS THAT A REQUIRED RESPONSE IS AN OFFICIAL DUTY."
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10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
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12	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Law enforcement agency request that employer or former employer
13	provide information on applicant for peace officer position. (1) A current or former employer shall MAY SHALL,
14	upon request of a law enforcement agency, provide the following information, if available, to the law enforcement
15	agency regarding a current or former employee who is an applicant for a peace officer position with the law
16	enforcement agency:
17	(a) the date on which employment began and the termination date if the individual is no longer
18	employed by the employer;
19	(b) the compensation provided the individual;
20	(c) an application for employment submitted to the employer;
21	(d) <u>A GENERAL STATEMENT CONCERNING</u> the individual's performance evaluations and disciplinary action;
22	(e) a record of GENERAL STATEMENT CONCERNING the individual's absences and attendance; AND
23	(f) a statement whether the employer would hire the individual if the individual were applying for a
24	position and if the employer would not hire the individual, the reason why, except as provided in 39-2-801; and
25	(g) (F) if the individual is no longer employed by the employer, the reason why and <u>A STATEMENT OF</u>
26	whether the individual:
27	(I) left voluntarily: or
28	(II) was terminated by the employer , except as provided in 39-2-801 ;
29	(III) RESIGNED AFTER BEING TOLD THAT THE INDIVIDUAL WOULD BE FIRED;
30	(IV) LEFT BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT BECAUSE OF SPECIFIC WORK-RELATED PROBLEMS; OR



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1	(V) HAD A TERMINATION CHANGED TO A RESIGNATION BY MUTUAL AGREEMENT.
2	(2) The request must be in writing, CONTAIN THE DATE BY WHICH THE RESPONSE IS NEEDED, BE presented
3	to the employer in person by an employee of the law enforcement agency or of a law enforcement agency
4	authorized by the requesting agency to present the request OR BY CERTIFIED MAIL, and contain the applicant's
5	signed and notarized consent to the employer's release of the information. THE APPLICANT, UPON REQUEST, MUST
6	BE PROVIDED BY THE LAW ENFORCEMENT AGENCY WITH A COPY OF ALL INFORMATION PROVIDED IN RESPONSE TO A
7	REQUEST UNDER THIS SECTION.
8	(3) The law enforcement agency may use the information to assist in determining the suitability of an
9	applicant for employment as a peace officer.
10	(4) The law enforcement agency shall keep the information confidential, except that it may, UNDER THE
11	PROCEDURE CONTAINED IN SUBSECTION (2), provide the information to another law enforcement agency to which
12	the individual applies for a position as a peace officer, which shall also keep the information confidential.
13	(5) A private AN employer who discloses information about a current or former employee under this
14	section is not liable for civil damages for the disclosure or any consequences related to the disclosure unless
15	the employer knowingly, purposely, or negligently disclosed information that was false. For the purposes of this
16	section, the definitions of knowingly, purposely, and negligently are those contained in 45-2-101 PERFORMS AN
17	OFFICIAL DUTY WITHIN THE MEANING OF 27-1-804(1).
18	(6) As used in this section, the following definitions apply:
19	(a) "Employer" includes a private employer, the state, and any local government or subdivision of the
20	state.
21	(b) "Law enforcement agency" has the meaning provided MEANS ANY STATE OR LOCAL AGENCY OR
22	SUBDIVISION OF THE STATE THAT EMPLOYS LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICERS AS DEFINED in 7-32-201.
23	(c) "Peace officer" has the meaning provided in 45-2-101.
24	(7) This section does not affect any immunity otherwise available under 27-1-804(1) for
25	COMMUNICATIONS VOLUNTARILY MADE BY PRIVATE OR PUBLIC, CURRENT OR FORMER EMPLOYERS IN THE PROPER
26	DISCHARGE OF AN OFFICIAL DUTY.

28	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
29	integral part of Title 7, chapter 32, and the provisions of Title 7 39, CHAPTER 2, AND THE PROVISIONS OF TITLE 39,
30	CHAPTER 2, apply to [section 1].
