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1	gas conservation shall use a grant that received priority under this subsection (2)(a) for oil and gas reclamation			
2	projects. The board may use a maximum of 2.5% of the amount of a grant for administrative costs associated			
3	with implementing the projects covered in the grant.			
4	(b) Any unobligated fund balance of a grant that received priority under subsection (2)(a) remaining at			
5	the end of the current biennium must be included as part of the \$600,000 limitation for the next biennium.			
6	(c) The priority given to the board of oil and gas conservation under subsection (2)(a) does not preclud			
7	the board of oil and gas conservation from submitting additional grant requests. The department shall evaluate			
8	additional grant requests from the board of oil and gas conservation in accordance with the provisions of			
9	subsection (1).			
10	(3) Subject to the conditions of this part, the department shall give priority to grant requests not to			
11	exceed a total of \$800,000 for the biennium for abandoned mine reclamation projects. A grant may not be used			
12	for personnel costs or general operating expenses.			
13	(2) (A) SUBJECT TO THE CONDITIONS OF THIS PART, THE DEPARTMENT SHALL GIVE PRIORITY TO GRANT			
14	REQUESTS, NOT TO EXCEED A TOTAL OF \$200,000 FOR THE BIENNIUM, FROM THE BOARD OF OIL AND GAS CONSERVATION
