13	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:
14	
15	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Tower Rock historic site. (1) A 136-acre site that encompasses Tower
16	Rock, a geologic structure listed in the national register of historic places on March 18, 2002, may not be sold
17	or transferred to a nonstate entity and must remain intact as the property of the state of Montana to recognize
18	the national and local historic significance of the Lewis and Clark expedition, whose members named the rock
19	formation, according to notations in the July 16 and 17, 1805, journals of Meriwether Lewis.
20	(2) The department of transportation may transfer the land to another state agency, and the provisions
21	of 60-4-201 through 60-4-203 do not apply. In any transfer of the site, the department of transportation may
22	retain access rights where the site abuts interstate 15.

24	NEW SECTION. Section 2. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an
25	integral part of Title 22, chapter 3, and the provisions of Title 22, chapter 3, apply to [section 1].
