4	A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT SUBMITTING TO THE QUALIFIED ELECTORS OF MONTANA AI		
5	AMENDMENT TO ARTICLE IV, SECTION 8, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION AND ARTICLE V, SECTION		
6	3, OF THE MONTANA CONSTITUTION TO EXTEND THE TERMS OF REPRESENTATIVES TO 4 YEARS AN		
7	SENATORS TO 6 YEARS; EXTENDING TERM LIMITS FOR REPRESENTATIVES AND SENATORS TO		
8	REFLECT THE EXTENDED TERMS; REMOVING THE REQUIREMENT THAT ONE-HALF OF THE		
9	SENATORS BE ELECTED EVERY 2 YEARS; AND PROVIDING AN IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVE DATE."

11	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:		
12			
13	Section 1. Article IV, section 8, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:		
14	"Section 8. Limitation on terms of office. (1) The secretary of state or other authorized official shall		
15	not certify a candidate's nomination or election to, or print or cause to be printed on any ballot the name of a		
16	candidate for, one of the following offices if, at the end of the current term of that office, the candidate will have		
17	served in that office or had he not resigned or been recalled would have served in that office:		
18	(a) 8 or more years in any 16-year period as governor, lieutenant governor, secretary of state, state		
19	auditor, attorney general, or superintendent of public instruction;		
20	(b) 8 12 or more years in any 16-year 24-year period as a state representative;		
21	(c) 8 <u>12</u> or more years in any 16-year <u>24-year</u> period as a state senator;		
22	(d) 6 or more years in any 12-year period as a member of the U.S. house of representatives; and		
23	(e) 12 or more years in any 24-year period as a member of the U.S. senate.		
24	(2) When computing time served for purposes of subsection (1), the provisions of subsection (1) do not		
25	apply to time served in terms that end during or prior to January 1993.		
26	(3) Nothing contained herein shall preclude an otherwise qualified candidate from being certified as		
27	nominated or elected by virtue of write-in votes cast for said candidate."

29	Section 2. Article V, section 3, of The Constitution of the State of Montana is amended to read:		
30	"Section 3. Election and terms. A member of the house of representatives shall be elected for a term		



1	of two <u>four</u> years and a member of the senate for a term of four <u>six</u> years each to begin on a date provided by			
2	law. One-half of the senators shall be elected every two years."

4	NEW SECTION. Section 3. Effective date. This amendment is effective on approval by the electorate.

6	NEW SECTION. Section 4. Submission to electorate. This amendment shall be submitted to the			
7	qualified electors of Montana at the general election to be held in November 2004 by printing on the ballot the			
8	full title of this act and the following:			
9	[]	FOR extending the terms of legislators and term limits for legislators and removing the		
10		requirement that one-half of senators be elected every 2 years.		
11	[]	AGAINST extending the terms of legislators and term limits for legislators and removing the		
12		requirement that one-half of senators be elected every 2 years.
