2	INTRODUCED BY HURWITZ, BUZZAS, GRIMES, KEENAN, A. OLSON
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4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA REQUESTING THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES
6	CONDUCT A STUDY REGARDING THE MONTANA MEDICAID PROGRAM AND HEALTH PROGRAMS
7	ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT AND PROVIDE A REPORT TO THE 59TH LEGISLATURE,
8	OUTLINING OPTIONS THAT MAY BE UNDERTAKEN TO REDESIGN THE MONTANA MEDICAID PROGRAM
9	HEALTH PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT.
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11	WHEREAS, rising health care costs, expanded use of services, and increased enrollment IN THE
12	MONTANA MEDICAID PROGRAM, THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN, THE STATE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE
13	PROGRAM, AND OTHER HEALTH PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN
14	SERVICES have resulted in escalating costs for the Montana Medicaid program TO THE STATE OF MONTANA; and
15	WHEREAS, expenditures in the Montana Medicaid program for the 2002-03 biennium are projected to
16	be \$1,071,000,000, which includes \$267 million in general fund money and \$804 million in federal funds; and
17	WHEREAS, EXPENDITURES IN THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN FOR THE 2002-03 BIENNIUM ARE
18	PROJECTED TO BE \$20,507,133 IN STATE GENERAL FUND MONEY; AND
19	WHEREAS, EXPENDITURES IN THE STATE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM FOR THE 2002-03
20	BIENNIUM ARE PROJECTED TO BE \$28,967,574, WHICH INCLUDES \$5,472,768 IN STATE GENERAL FUND MONEY, \$882
21	IN STATE SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS, AND \$23,493,934 IN FEDERAL SPECIAL REVENUE FUNDS; AND
22	WHEREAS, expenditures in the Montana Medicaid program, THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN, AND
23	THE STATE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM constitute a significant portion of the state general fund; and
24	WHEREAS, federal regulations limit the discretion that states have in the administration of the Medicaid
25	program; and
26	WHEREAS, federal regulations mandate that certain health care services be provided and that certain
27	groups be automatically eligible for Medicaid; and
28	WHEREAS, federal regulations do permit the Secretary of the U.S. Department of Health and Human
29	Services to grant waivers of certain federal requirements; and
30	WHEREAS, FEDERAL REGULATIONS AND THE CENTERS FOR MEDICARE AND MEDICAID SERVICES REQUIRE
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1 THREE FORMAL CONSULTATIONS WITH TRIBAL GOVERNMENTS REGARDING ANY MAJOR CHANGES WITHIN THE EXISTING 2 MEDICAID PROGRAM AND RELATED PROGRAMS; AND 3 WHEREAS, THE STATE OF MONTANA RECOGNIZES THE SEVEN FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBES IN 4 MONTANA, AND THE LEGISLATURE DIRECTS THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO RECOGNIZE 5 AND INCLUDE THE SEVEN FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED TRIBAL GOVERNMENTS IN MONTANA WITHIN ALL ASPECTS OF A 6 **DEPARTMENT STUDY; AND** 7 WHEREAS, UPON PARTICIPATION OF THE SEVEN FEDERALLY RECOGNIZED INDIAN TRIBES IN MONTANA, THE 8 LEGISLATURE DIRECTS THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES TO INCLUDE THE SEVEN TRIBAL 9 GOVERNMENTS IN ANY ASPECT OF THE STUDY AND INCLUDE THE RECOMMENDATIONS AND PARTICIPATION IN THE REPORT 10 TO THE LEGISLATURE; AND 11 WHEREAS, it is essential that the Legislature as a whole be informed about the alternative approaches 12 that may be undertaken and that the Legislature set the policy regarding the design of the Montana Medicaid 13 program, THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN, THE STATE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND OTHER 14 HEALTH PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES. 15 16 NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF 17 THE STATE OF MONTANA: 18 That the Department of Public Health and Human Services direct sufficient staff services to undertake 19 a study that will examine the various options available for the redesigning of the Montana Medicaid program, 20 THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN, THE STATE CHILDREN'S HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND OTHER HEALTH 21 PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT. 22 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Health and Human Services report on a 23 regular basis to the Children, Families, Health, and Human Services Interim Committee and to the Legislative 24 Finance Committee regarding the progress of the study. 25 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Department of Public Health and Human Services prepare a 26 report to the 59th Legislature, as provided in section 5-11-210, MCA, detailing various options available for the



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redesign of the Montana Medicaid program, including THE MENTAL HEALTH SERVICES PLAN, THE STATE CHILDREN'S

HEALTH INSURANCE PROGRAM, AND OTHER HEALTH PROGRAMS ADMINISTERED BY THE DEPARTMENT. THIS REPORT

SHOULD INCLUDE the COSTS, BOTH economic and social costs, associated with various options FOR REDESIGN OF

THESE PROGRAMS AND A COST ANALYSIS FOR URBAN INDIAN HEALTH CLINICS AND TRIBAL-BASED HEALTH CLINICS.

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- 1 BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE SECRETARY OF STATE SEND A COPY OF THIS RESOLUTION TO EACH
- 2 TRIBAL GOVERNMENT LOCATED ON THE SEVEN MONTANA RESERVATIONS AND TO THE LITTLE SHELL BAND OF CHIPPEWA.

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
