4	A JOINT RESOLUTION OF THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF THE STATE OF
5	MONTANA AUTHORIZING ENCOURAGING THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN
6	SERVICES TO DEVELOP INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS WITHIN THE TEMPORARY ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY
7	FAMILIES PROGRAM THAT DIVERT FAMILIES FROM RECEIVING CASH ASSISTANCE AND THAT
8	PROVIDE A PATHWAY OUT OF POVERTY.
9	
10	WHEREAS, the goal of the Temporary Assistance for Needy Families (TANF) program is to assist
11	families in achieving economic self-sufficiency, but the evaluation of the Montana program shows that families
12	who leave the program do not attain self-sufficiency and remain in low-income jobs with limited, if any, benefits;
13	and
14	WHEREAS, the TANF caseload has recently increased and the limited funding only allows for cash
15	$assistance\ payments\ and\ minimal\ work\ experience\ programs\ to\ ensure\ that\ the\ state\ meets\ its\ work\ participation$
16	rate; and
17	WHEREAS, Montana's Human and Community Services Division is committed to assisting families to
18	move out of poverty, not locking them into minimum wage employment that keeps them in poverty; and
19	WHEREAS, Montana has successful initial experience with asset-building programs, assisting over 175
20	low-income families in Missoula, Billings, and Helena to build individual development accounts and to use them
21	to go to school, start businesses, and become homeowners; and
22	WHEREAS, low-income families need a stable income package so that they can achieve personal
23	savings and commercial credit to build assets.

25	NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE SENATE AND THE HOUSE OF REPRESENTATIVES OF
26	THE STATE OF MONTANA:
27	That the Department of Public Health and Human Services be authorized ENCOURAGED to develop an
28	innovative program within the Temporary Assistance to Needy Families program that diverts families, INCLUDING
29	NATIVE AMERICAN FAMILIES, from the assistance program and provides a pathway out of poverty. The program

1	(1) assist families to build assets, such as personal savings and commercial credit, and use individual
2	development accounts;
3	(2) provide a stable income base on which to build;
4	(3) assist participation in post-secondary education and high-wage training;
5	(4) coordinate access to any other support programs for which a family may qualify including Medicaid
6	and child care; and
7	(5) not count against FOR GOOD CAUSE, ALLOW FOR THE REASONABLE EXTENSION OF NOT COUNT AGAINST
8	the time limits for assistance, BUT IT IS NOT THE INTENT OF THE LEGISLATURE TO EXTEND THE 5-YEAR LIMIT ON TANK
9	ASSISTANCE.
10	BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, THAT THE DEPARTMENT OF PUBLIC HEALTH AND HUMAN SERVICES BE
11	ENCOURAGED TO DEVELOP INNOVATIVE PROGRAMS IN TRIBAL COMMUNITIES.
