16	NEW SECTION. Section 1. Unlawful possession of open alcoholic beverage container in motor
17	vehicle on highway. (1) Except as provided in subsection (2), a person commits the offense of unlawful
18	possession of an open alcoholic beverage container in a motor vehicle if the person knowingly possesses an
19	open alcoholic beverage container within the passenger area of a motor vehicle on a highway.
20	(2) This section does not apply to an open alcoholic beverage container:
21	(a) in a locked glove compartment or storage compartment;
22	(b) in a motor vehicle trunk or luggage compartment or in a truck bed or cargo compartment;
23	(c) behind the last upright seat of a motor vehicle that is not equipped with a trunk;
24	(d) in a closed container in the area of a motor vehicle that is not equipped with a trunk and that is not
25	normally occupied by the driver or a passenger; or
26	(e) in the immediate possession of a passenger:
27	(i) of a motor vehicle, including a bus, taxi, or limousine, that is used for the transportation of persons
28	for compensation and that includes the provision of a hired driver; or
29	(ii) in the living quarters of a camper, travel trailer, or motor home.

1 in a motor vehicle shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100.2

NEW SECTION. Section 2. Unlawful consumption of alcoholic beverage while driving or in actual physical control of motor vehicle on highway. (1) A person commits the offense of unlawful consumption of an alcoholic beverage in a motor vehicle if the person knowingly consumes an alcoholic beverage while the

person is driving or in actual physical control of a motor vehicle on a highway.

(2) A person convicted of the offense of unlawful consumption of an alcoholic beverage in a motor vehicle shall be fined an amount not to exceed \$100.

NEW SECTION. Section 3. Definitions. As used in [sections 1 and 2], the following definitions apply:

- (1) "Alcoholic beverage" means a compound produced for human consumption as a drink that contains not less than 0.5% of alcohol by volume.
- (2) "Bus" means a motor vehicle with a manufacturer's rated seating capacity of 11 or more passengers, including the driver.
 - (3) "Camper" has the meaning provided in 61-1-129.
 - (4) "Highway" has the meaning provided in 61-1-201, including the shoulders of the highway.
 - (5) "Motor home" has the meaning provided in 61-1-130.
- 18 (6) "Motor vehicle" has the meaning provided in 61-1-102.
 - (7) "Open alcoholic beverage container" means a bottle, can, jar, or other receptacle that contains any amount of an alcoholic beverage and that is open, has a broken seal, or the contents of which are partially removed or are immediately capable of being consumed.
 - (8) "Passenger area" means the area designed to seat the driver and passengers while a motor vehicle is in operation and any area that is readily accessible to the driver or a passenger while the driver or a passenger is seated in the vehicle, including an unlocked glove compartment.
