10	BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

12	Section 1. Section 39-3-409, MCA, is amended to read:
13	"39-3-409. Adoption of minimum wage rates exception. (1) The commissioner shall adopt rules
14	to establish a minimum wage that, except as provided in subsection subsections (2) through (4), must be the
15	same greater of either:
16	(a) the minimum hourly wage rate as provided under the federal Fair Labor Standards Act of 1938 (29
17	U.S.C. 206(a)(1)) , ; or
18	(b) (i) \$5.75 an hour beginning July 1, 2003; and
19	(ii) \$6.25 an hour beginning July 1, 2004.
20	(2) The rates established under subsection (1) exclude excluding the value of tips received by the
21	employee and the special provisions for a training wage.
22	(2)(3) The minimum wage rate for a business whose annual gross sales are \$110,000 or less is \$4 ar
23	hour.
24	(4) In lieu of the increase in minimum wage provided in subsections (1)(b)(i) and (1)(b)(ii), an employed
25	may apply an amount equivalent to the increase toward a new or existing bona fide employee health care plan.
