

## 1 SENATE BILL NO. 190

2 INTRODUCED BY J. BALYEAT

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4 A BILL FOR AN ACT ENTITLED: "AN ACT CREATING AN AUCTION FOR A MOUNTAIN GOAT LICENSE;  
5 AND AMENDING SECTION 87-1-601, MCA."

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7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF MONTANA:

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9 NEW SECTION. **Section 1. Auction of mountain goat license.** (1) The commission may issue one  
10 male mountain goat license each year through a competitive auction. The commission shall promulgate rules  
11 for the use of the license and conduct of the auction. A wildlife conservation organization involved in the  
12 conservation of mountain goats may be authorized by the commission to conduct the license auction, in which  
13 case the authorized organization may retain proceeds of the sale, not to exceed 10%, to cover reasonable  
14 auction expenses.

15 (2) All proceeds remaining from the auction, whether conducted by the commission or as otherwise  
16 authorized by the commission, must be used by the department for the substantial benefit of mountain goats.  
17 The proceeds from the auction must be used in addition to any other funds the department uses for the  
18 management of mountain goats. The department shall report the use or investment of auction proceeds to the  
19 office of budget and program planning as a part of the information required by 17-7-111.

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21 **Section 2.** Section 87-1-601, MCA, is amended to read:

22 **"87-1-601. Use of fish and game money.** (1) (a) Except as provided in subsections (7) and (9), all  
23 money collected or received from the sale of hunting and fishing licenses or permits, from the sale of seized  
24 game or hides, from damages collected for violations of the fish and game laws of this state, or from  
25 appropriations or received by the department from any other state source must be turned over to the department  
26 of revenue and placed in the state special revenue fund to the credit of the department.

27 (b) Any money received from federal sources must be deposited in the federal special revenue fund  
28 to the credit of the department.

29 (c) All interest earned on money from the following sources must be placed in the state special revenue  
30 fund to the credit of the department:

- 1 (i) the general license account;
- 2 (ii) the license drawing account;
- 3 (iii) accounts established to administer the provisions of 87-1-246, 87-1-258, 87-1-605, 87-2-411,
- 4 87-2-722, ~~and 87-2-724,~~ and [section 1]; and
- 5 (iv) money received from the sale of any other hunting and fishing license.
- 6 (2) Except as provided in 87-2-411, the money described in subsection (1) must be exclusively set apart
- 7 and made available for the payment of all salaries, per diem, fees, expenses, and expenditures authorized to
- 8 be made by the department under the terms of this title. The money described in subsection (1) must be spent
- 9 for those purposes by the department, subject to appropriation by the legislature.
- 10 (3) Any reference to the fish and game fund in this code means fish and game money in the state
- 11 special revenue fund and the federal special revenue fund.
- 12 (4) Except as provided in subsections (7) and (8), all money collected or received from fines and
- 13 forfeited bonds, except money collected or received by a justice's court, that relates to violations of state fish and
- 14 game laws under Title 87 must be deposited by the department of revenue and credited to the department in
- 15 a state special revenue fund account for this purpose. Out of any fine imposed by a court for the violation of the
- 16 fish and game laws, the costs of prosecution must be paid to the county where the trial was held in any case in
- 17 which the fine is not imposed in addition to the costs of prosecution.
- 18 (5) (a) Money must be deposited in an account in the permanent fund if it is received by the department
- 19 from:
- 20 (i) the sale of surplus real property;
- 21 (ii) exploration or development of oil, gas, or mineral deposits from lands acquired by the department
- 22 except royalties or other compensation based on production; and
- 23 (iii) leases of interests in department real property not contemplated at the time of acquisition.
- 24 (b) The interest derived from the account, but not the principal, may be used only for the purpose of
- 25 operation, development, and maintenance of real property of the department and only upon appropriation by
- 26 the legislature. If the use of money as set forth in this section would result in violation of applicable federal laws
- 27 or state statutes specifically naming the department or money received by the department, then the use of this
- 28 money must be limited in the manner, method, and amount to those uses that do not result in a violation.
- 29 (6) Money received from the collection of license drawing applications is not subject to the deposit
- 30 requirements of 17-6-105. The department shall deposit license drawing application money within a reasonable

1 time after receipt.

2 (7) Money collected or received from fines or forfeited bonds for the violation of 77-1-801, 77-1-806,  
3 or rules adopted under 77-1-804 must be deposited in the state general fund.

4 (8) The department of revenue shall deposit in the state general fund one-half of the money received  
5 from the fines pursuant to 87-1-102.

6 (9) (a) The department shall deposit all money received from the search and rescue surcharge in  
7 87-2-202 in a state special revenue account to the credit of the department for search and rescue purposes as  
8 provided for in 10-3-801.

9 (b) Upon certification by the department of reimbursement requests submitted by the department of  
10 military affairs for search and rescue missions involving persons engaged in hunting, fishing, or trapping, the  
11 department may transfer funds from the special revenue account to the search and rescue account provided  
12 for in 10-3-801 to reimburse counties for the costs of those missions as provided in 10-3-801.

13 (c) Using funds in the department's search and rescue account that are not already committed to  
14 reimbursement for search and rescue missions, the department may provide matching funds to the department  
15 of military affairs to reimburse counties for search and rescue training and equipment costs up to the proportion  
16 that the number of search and rescue missions involving persons engaged in hunting, fishing, or trapping bears  
17 to the statewide total of search and rescue missions.

18 (d) At the end of each fiscal year, any money remaining in the special revenue account after the  
19 transfers provided for in this section must be transferred to the general license account of the department."

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21 NEW SECTION. Section 3. Codification instruction. [Section 1] is intended to be codified as an  
22 integral part of Title 87, chapter 2, part 7, and the provisions of Title 87, chapter 2, part 7, apply to [section 1].

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
